

THE LITURGY OF THE DAY

SEPTEMBER 7, 2025 / TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Wisdom 9:13-18b/ Philemon 9-10, 12-17/ Luke 14:25-33

Jesus' words to the crowds are difficult to hear. The demands he makes of his disciples are too much. Hate your family? Carry your own cross? Renounce all your possessions? They range from unreasonable to unthinkable. Can he possibly mean to be so harsh? First, consider that the use of the Greek misei for hating one's family could well be an example of semitic hyperbole, intended to shock when "reject," not "hate," could be more appropriate. Secondly, renouncing all possessions doesn't necessarily mean leaving oneself destitute, but no longer regarding what you have as your own property. To follow Jesus means to choose Jesus, who gives us everything we need, even the promise of eternal life, over those things most dear to us: our families, our homes, our wealth, and all our "stuff." Let us look to his first disciples: the twelve apostles. They left their families, their homes, and their possessions, choosing to live a difficult lifestyle instead. Every day they calculated the cost of discipleship and concluded that following Jesus was worth everything they gave up.

Question of the Week: How do I feel challenged by Jesus' demands of discipleship?

Gospel Meditation

One hot Arizona summer afternoon my car ran out of gas. I phoned the parish office and begged for help. My secretary came and helped me fill the gas tank. She chided me, "If you can't manage getting your car from A to B, how can we expect you to guide the parish where it needs to go?" Point taken, Julie. I vowed to always make sure I have plenty of gas in my car.

The Lord Jesus chides us in this week's Gospel, too. He uses the two images of a man building a tower and a king marching soldiers into war to make this single point: acquire what is needed to follow him or look ridiculous. We rightly mock the builder who lacks money for his tower and the king with a short-handed army. But our mocking boomerangs back on us. How do we expect to follow Jesus to the end with insufficient detachment from our possessions and divided hearts?

The good news is, there is still time. Jesus is building a great tower to heaven-his own body. So we renounce all and give ourselves to him as his precious stones. Jesus is waging a battle against our enemy. So we forsake all and swear allegiance and march under his banner. In this way, we will finish what has begun in our discipleship. Or better put, our Lord will have the stones and soldiers required to see his great work through.



SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (Confession) Saturday 5:00-5:30 p.m. or by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM Adults are baptized at the Easter Vigil as part of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). Infant and child Baptisms are by arrangement.

FIRST EUCHARIST Preparation begins in grade one and includes classes, retreats, and home instruction. Children receive First Eucharist in grade two.

CONFIRMATION Our Confirmation program begins in the 9th grade; students are confirmed in the spring of the 10th grade. For young adults who have been baptized but not yet confirmed, contact the parish office.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY It is the policy of the Diocese of Worcester that a couple should contact the parish at least one year prior to the anticipated date of their wedding to allow sufficient time to carry out the various steps of the marriage preparation process. It is important that arrangements be made with the church before plans are made with reception halls, caterers, etc.

7 Saints for Back — to – School Season

It's here already—back-to-school season. Every August, it seems to sneak up on us. The start of a new school year can feel a little overwhelming, but it's also a fresh opportunity, for students and non-students alike, to get organized, refocus our priorities, be inspired to keep learning, and pursue excellence. As Catholics, we don't have to face this season on our own. The saints are powerful intercessors and faithful friends who want to help us along the way. Here are seven saints to pray with during this back-to-school season:

St. Thomas Aguinas – Patron of Scholars

St. Thomas is a classic patron for students. He wasn't just brilliant—he also knew how to place his learning in service of God. His famous prayer before study is still prayed by students today. Pray to him when: you need focus, clarity, and the wisdom to use your studies we'll.

St. Joseph of Cupertino – Patron of Exams Known for his struggles in academics, St. Joseph passed his priestly exams by a small miracle. His story gives hope to anyone who feels overwhelmed by tests. Pray to him when: you're facing exams or presentations and need peace and confidence.

St. Catherine of Alexandria – Patron of Students and Philosophers Brilliant, articulate, and courageous, St. Catherine defended the faith with wisdom that amazed scholars of her time. Pray to her when: you're writing essays, preparing debates, or need courage to stand up for the truth.

St. Monica – Patron of Mothers St. Monica prayed faithfully for her son, St. Augustine, through years of difficulty. She is a model of perseverance and trust in God. Pray to her when: you feel worried about your children's choices or need encouragement to stay patient and prayerful.

St. Joseph – Patron of Workers and Families




