Confirmation Behavior Policy

1. Classes will begin promptly at 9:00AM on Saturday morning (see calendar) for Confirmation Preparation Candidates. Candidates will assemble in the Parish Hall for the beginning of the session and dismissal will be at 2:00PM.
2. Candidates should dress appropriately. Jeans are permitted. Inappropriate language or design on any piece of clothing is unacceptable. Knee length shorts may be worn. Biking shorts are not permitted. Students failing to dress appropriately will be sent home. **Gum is not allowed at any time.**
3. Candidates are required by the Archdiocese of New Orleans to attend Religious Education classes **in addition** to Sacrament Preparation classes. **The only excused absence is a death in the family or a Doctor's excuse for illness. Any unexcused absences will result in the candidate not receiving the sacrament.**
4. Tardiness is quite inconvenient to the teacher and other students. Please make every effort to arrive on time for class.
5. Parents we ask you to take care of all business matters through the Parish office.
6. We ask that all cell phones be placed on silent and not used during the class.
7. Candidates begin their instruction of Christian principles within your home. Our Catechists encourage sharing with and caring for each other. Parents, you have entrusted your young adults to us and for their well-being, the following actions will not be tolerated:

This is a very important question that you ask yourself. When choosing a sponsor, you should know that a sponsor is someone who is baptized, has received the Sacrament of Confirmation and is and practicing their Catholic faith by attending regular Mass. (Your parent cannot be your sponsor.)

A sponsor’s role involves giving personal support, friendship, and encouragement to you. A sponsor must commit and take an interest in your Confirmation program. Also, a sponsor can and most likely will experience a deepening of their own Catholic faith.

In order for the person you have chosen to be your sponsor they must be able to answer yes to all of the following questions. If they cannot answer yes honestly, you much choose someone else.

1. The Sponsor must be a Catholic in good standing with the Church who has been Confirmed and regularly practices his/her Catholic faith;
2. The Sponsor must be at least sixteen years of age;
3. If married, the Sponsor must be in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church. Person may not be cohabiting (living together without marriage);
4. If not previously attended, the Sponsor will attend appropriate preparation for fulfilling this role (Confirmation information meeting)

Choosing Your "Confirmation" Name

DUE DATE: SATURDAY, FEBRUARY -2026

In both the Old and New Testaments, when God had a new mission for someone, He often gave them a new name. God calls on each of us to fulfill a special mission. It may be converting non-believers, helping the poor, being a peacemaker, or one of many other callings. Confirmation may be the spark that helps you begin a mission that is close to your heart.

Your confirmation is an opportunity to enter into a deeper relationship with God and with the Church. One custom of Confirmation is to choose a new name to symbolize this relationship. The "*Confirmation Name*" is used in the ceremony of the Celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Choose your Christian Baptismal name or a Saint's name for your Confirmation name. Candidates are required to submit a one page essay including the following:

- 1) What are the life events of your Saint and why did you choose this Saint.**
- 2) How did your Saint demonstrate his/her faithfulness or friendship with God during their lifetime?**
- 3) What incident in this Saint's life inspires you?**
- 4) Relate an event or action by your Saint that you can imitate in your life, or strive to imitate?**
- 5) Conclude your essay with a one to three line prayer to your Saint.**

Remember the Saint you choose will become your intercessor, one who speaks on behalf of you in heaven. Your relationship with your Saint will become stronger and powerful as you talk and pray for intercession to your Saint.

Your name gives you an identity: it tells others who you are. When you were baptized, your parents chose your name. If you do not know your parents' reason for choosing your name, ask them about it. Now, you are about to be confirmed. It is time for you to choose the name you will take as a sign of your spiritual identity and reflection of your faith.

The tradition of taking on a new name to show a new role can be traced back to the Old Testament. When Abram was called to lead his people to believe in the one God, his name was changed from Abram, meaning of “father of many”, to Abraham, meaning “father of many nations.” Again, in the New Testament, we find Simon's name changed to Peter, meaning “rock” because he was to become the rock upon which Jesus founded His Church.

The choosing of a name symbolizes power or dominion, as in Genesis where God gave man the power to name and have dominion over each of the animals on the earth. In conjunction with this power is responsibility---- the responsibility of taking care of whatever is named. God entrusts each of us with this responsibility as well as the power.

Your Confirmation name should reflect your new role as a mature Christian –a symbol of what your Confirmation means to you. It should not be taken lightly and should not be chosen for frivolous reasons (“it looks nice with my first name” or “it sounds pretty”). Perhaps you would like to take the name of a person whom you admire. Many Confirmation candidates, recognizing the growing bond of love with their parents or a deepened relationship with aunts, uncles or godparents, will take one of their names. A candidate may even occasionally choose his or her own baptismal name, or the name of a saint honored as a patron of their family.

After deciding on your name, try to recognize the qualities or virtues that make this person unique or special. How can you imitate or acquire these qualities or virtues and make them part of your life. How can you become a better Christian? The only limit that is placed on your choice of names is that it must be a saint's name or a familiar derivative of the name.

Candidates should be dressed in an appropriate manner when attending classes.

Confirmation Dress Code for Candidates and Sponsors

Confirmation is a *solemn spiritual occasion* for all of our candidates, sponsors and our parish community. Candidates and Sponsors must be dressed in an appropriate manner when being presented to the Archbishop for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Here are some guidelines we ask you to pay particular attention to and the style of dress chosen by you for this occasion.

Dress Code for Men

- 1) Suit, shirt and tie or jacket, shirt, tie and dress pants may be worn.
No jeans or cargo pants.
- 2) Dress socks and shoes only, no sneakers.
- 3) No spiked hair or colored hair.
- 4) No caps or hats.
- 5) No visible tattoos or piercings (tongue, ear, nose or eyebrow)

Dress Code for Women

- 1) Dresses should be knee length, "Sunday best," and age appropriate.
- 2) No backless, strapless, spaghetti straps, coldshoulder dresses or dresses with slits be allowed. All straps should be at least 3/4" to 1" wide. (You can wear a wrap or jacket that is not see-through that stays in place during the ceremony.) The back of the dress **must be** above bra level.
- 3) The front of the dress **cannot** be low cut with cleavage visible.
- 4) Dress shoes cannot be flip-flops and excessive high heels are not appropriate.
- 5) No visible tattoos or piercings (tongue, nose or eyebrow)
