

Canonization of John Henry Newman

John Henry Newman (1801-1890), a convert to Catholicism, was renowned as a writer, poet, educator, priest, hymn-writer, orator and Cardinal. As a theologian, he left an important legacy in his teaching including his view on the development of Catholic doctrine. He is often referred to as "the Father of Vatican II".

He will be canonized on Sunday, October 13 in St. Peter's Square, together with four others.

Fr. Ken Wolfe will facilitate two showings of Bishop Barron's one-hour video biography of Blessed John Henry Newman, The Convert (followed by a Q + A for those who wish to remain) on
