

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I love this quote from the English author C.S. Lewis:

"Perfect love, we know, casteth out fear. But so do several other things — ignorance, alcohol, passion, presumption, and stupidity. It is very desirable that we should all advance to that perfection of love in which we shall fear no longer; but it is very undesirable, until we have reached that stage, that we should allow any inferior agent to cast out our fear." -- C.S. Lewis, *The World's Last Night*

Lewis' statement harmonizes with today's Gospel passage about preparing for the Second Coming of Christ (and for the end of our life on Earth). In St. Luke we hear Jesus say, *"Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom."* (Luke 12:32)

"God desires everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." (1 Timothy 2:4) God is pleased to love everyone eternally. Therefore, we disciples strive to love God and our neighbor. The worries and fears of the world (and fear of the end of the world) are cast out by practical, daily acts of love. We should not settle for anything less.






Religious Education Registration is Now Open


