The Misconception of the Sacrament of Anointing -

The great loss of so many Catholics comes from saying NO to receiving the Sacrament of Anointing. The misconception comes from individuals believing the Sacrament of Anointing/Healing is "Last Rites". This is far from the truth. Sacrament of Anointing/Healing comes from the time of Jesus and the many he healed. The Sacrament provides special blessing to the individual both mentally and spiritually for strength in accepting what is to come be it with aging, medical diagnosis, etc.. As with all our Sacraments, it is for the living. It can be received more than once. It is enduring. Do not wait to call a Priest before surgery or at the point of death, he might not be immediately available and the sadness is that the person missed the opportunity to celebrate and receive this Sacrament. If you are scheduled for surgery, call the office and schedule to meet with the Priest to be anointed. Attend First Friday anointing Mass. As soon as someone is sent to the hospital or hospice, call the parish office or better yet work with the hospital chaplain to have them call the church. If you receive a medical diagnosis, contact the parish office and request to be anointed. DO NOT WAIT! Not for yourself or for a loved one.

Baptismal Preparation Has Started

In order to have your child 7 and under baptized at St. Thomas the Apostle Parish, it is required that all children's mothers and fathers attend a series of two classes to prepare for this special moment in their child's life. Godparents of children being baptized here are also encouraged to attend. Parishioners who are seeking to be godparents elsewhere are also eligible to attend.

The **series of two classes** are offered on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month in the Chapel from 10:35 AM - 11:20 AM.

The first class is an overview of the Sacrament of Baptism; the Catholic view of what it means to be an adopted child of God. The second class reviews the academics of the rite of Baptism itself... what happens, as well as other logistics.

- 1) Place your rosary and all the parts (all the beads, crucifix and center medal) in a zip lock bag
- 2) Include an index card with your name, clearly printed, phone number and the mass you attend
- 3) Place the zip lock bag in the box marked broken rosaries. Ask an usher if you can't find the box.

When your rosary is finished we will call you and you may pick up your rosary at the Religious Education office before your Sunday Mass.

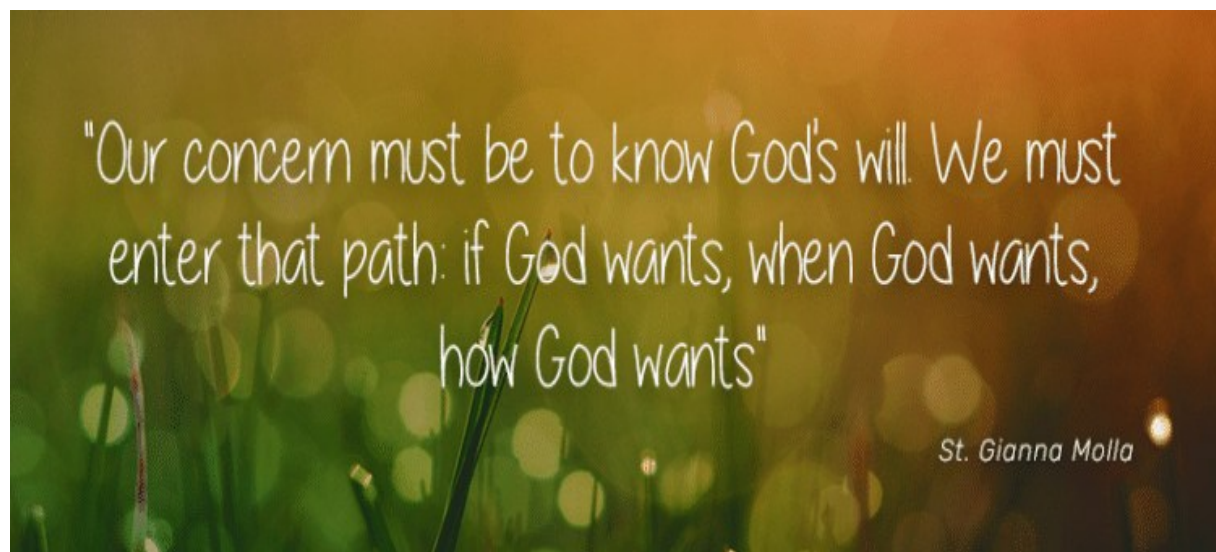

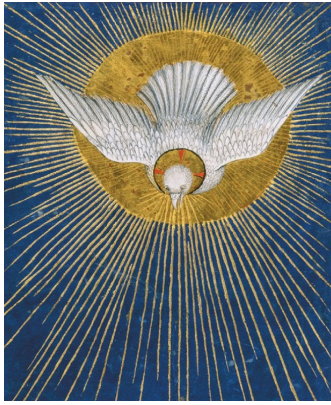
