Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is discouraging to see wars, civil unrest, divided society, and economic uncertainty. To address the world's problems, some folks might look to revolution and dark powers. Bartolo Longo did. He grew up in a well-off devout Catholic family in Italy. But by young adulthood, Bartolo was a priest of satan, enthralled with looking for answers in

powers not in virtues!

He went to law school in Naples and encountered folks whose interest in revolutionary ideas of science, reason, and politics was bound up in occult practices such as freemasonry, spiritualism, magic, and devil worship. Rather than gaining power over the troubles of the world, practice of the occult brought him depression, anxiety, confusion, and poor health.

A university professor who was Catholic, Vincenzo Pepe, noticed Longo's decline and confronted him, warning him that he was on the path to madness in this life and damnation in the next. He moved in with Pepe who introduced him to a Dominican priest Alberto Redente. He continued practicing law while serving the poor and the incurably sick. His spiritual, emotional, and physical health improved. But he worried that he might still lose his eternal life because of his blasphemy.

Peace came to him when he put into practice the Blessed Virgin's promise to St. Dominic, "Anyone who propagates my Rosary will be saved." He spent the rest of his life promoting peace and the prayer of the Rosary. He devoted his life to providing for the needs of the poor and prisoners. He was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize in 1902 and 1903. As a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem, his charity and passion for peace had an international dimension, reaching to the Holy Land.

Since October is the month of the Holy Rosary, it is appropriate that Bartolo Longo is being canonized today, October 19! In the late 1800's Barolo founded a confraternity of the Rosary and built a church dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary of Pompei. At age 85 in 1926, he died a saint, a husband, a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre, and a sign of hope in a confused world.

There is so much more to say about this new saint. He knew Pope Leo XIII (who encouraged his marriage engagement and made him a papal knight).
