# From the Parochial Vicar

Most of the year, our Paschal candle sits towards the back of the Church, by the baptismal font. But during these seven weeks of the Easter season, the Paschal candle is placed prominently in the sanctuary and is lit for every Mass. The Paschal candle symbolizes the light of the resurrected Christ. Some liturgists see symbolism to the elements of the candle: the white wax symbolizes the pure flesh that Jesus inherited from Mary, the wick symbolizes the soul that Jesus possesses as a human, and the flame symbolizes the divinity Jesus possesses as the second Person of the Holy Trinity.

If you came to the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, you may have noticed that the normal altar candles were gone. The absence of candles — a usual feature in Catholic churches — is a sharp reminder of Christ's absence after the Crucifixion. And then, after the sun sets on Holy Saturday, we begin our celebration of Christ's resurrection at the Easter Vigil. Each Easter Vigil, we light a new fire and bless it, then we bless a new Paschal candle for the upcoming year. The Paschal candle is carried into the dark church, symbolizing the resurrected Christ returning light to the world. Everyone in the church holds a small candle, which reminds us of Jesus's admonition to be like servants who light their lamps and await their master's return (Luke 12:35-36). The meaning of the Paschal candle is expressed in a beautiful song, the Exultet, as everyone holds their own candles. And as the Easter Vigil progresses, all the candles in the church are lit from the Paschal candle.

The Paschal candle remains in the sanctuary until the Ascension, a symbol of the time that the risen Jesus spent with his disciples. After the Solemnity of the Ascension, the Paschal candle is moved to its position by the baptismal font. During the remainder of the liturgical year, it will be lit for baptisms and funerals. At baptisms, it symbolizes the light of Christ entering the life of a newly baptized Christian. At a funeral, it reminds us of our hope that we can share in Christ's victory over the grave.

The Paschal candle is a very old Easter tradition. We have a letter that St. Jerome wrote in 384 AD to Presidius, a deacon in the city of Placentia. Presidius had asked Jerome to compose a "song of the candle" (in Latin, *carmen cerei*) for the church Presidius served. This would be an early form of the Exultet, and Jerome's reply makes clear that he is familiar with the Paschal candle and the song describing it. In *The City of God*, St. Augustine casually quotes a song of the candle. From this we can conclude that the Paschal candle was already a well-established Easter custom during the time of Jerome and Augustine. A few details have changed over the centuries, but the Paschal candle that sits in our sanctuary is a very ancient liturgical tradition.
