From the Pastor

October is respect life month. "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born, I consecrated you." Jeremiah 1:5. I find it fascinating that God has a plan for my life even from the very beginning of my existence. The fact that in the mind of the Almighty God of the Universe, He sees, hears, and knows little old me. That is a pretty amazing concept to contemplate. God knows us intimately; he thinks of us and loves us each individually. It is true for me and it is true for you. Every life has value in and of itself because God has created it.

I hope you've taken the time to read the little blurbs in the bulletin about the "decline to sign" initiative and the particular education needed around some of the measures attempting to make it onto next year's ballot. Please note that as a tax-exempt institution, yes, we have every right under American law speak out on moral issues. This is no way threatens a tax-exempt status. As a Church we may and must speak out on moral issues even when they appear on the political scene, and this is well within our legal purview to do so.

God has a plan for everyone; even for those we would be tempted to write off as useless to society. Besides, if a needy, poor, and helpless person causes us to stop thinking about ourselves for just a moment and help them, I'd say they serve a great purpose and have immense value in this world.

Abortion Amendment: Perhaps you've already seen them: activists standing outside the post office or grocery store, asking you to sign a petition that would amend South Dakota's Constitution. Many people are confused about what the issue is—and for good reason. At one signature-gathering location, a sign proclaimed: "Pro-Life, Pro-Family, Pro-Choice: Please sign the petition." But what does the petition actually propose? The official petition title—as written by the South Dakota Attorney General, not the sponsors—is "An Initiated Amendment Establishing a Right to Abortion in the State Constitution." That's a far more candid description of what the sponsors intend to do. This abortion amendment isn't pro-life or pro-family, and for many of South Dakota's most vulnerable residents, it isn't even "pro-choice." Preborn girls and boys obviously don't get to "choose" whether their lives will be ended through abortion. The group supporting the abortion amendment, which calls itself Dakotans for Health, says their goal is to "place a Roe v. Wade constitutional amendment on the ballot." Yet the amendment, if adopted, would enshrine a right to abortion in the state constitution that is far more radical than what was imposed under Roe.
