October 30, 2022: Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

COME QUICKLY AND FOLLOW HIM WITH JOY



Zacchaeus come down quickly for I must stay at your house! ...and he received him with joy!

Zacchaeus was quite interested in the Lord, Jesus but he really knew little about him or even why he wanted to make the tough climb up the sycamore tree to get a closer look. Being a person of short stature myself, it is no easy feat to scale a tree and hang out on a limb waiting for someone to pass by. I think Zacchaeus had no expectations about what might happen except that someone special was passing by. Ahh, but Jesus knew just what he wanted to do when he saw Zacchaeus: he made eye contact, and said hurry and come down (again a little difficult) and take me to your house for dinner. Jesus filled

Zacchaeus' heart with joy at the invitation!

When a person's heart is converted so thoroughly and surprisingly by Christ, that person is moved to service. Zacchaeus immediately knew what he had to do. He had to detach himself from his possessions, his wealth that was dragging him down and go and distribute it to the poor. Not only that, Jesus opened his heart to know that his wealth had not been acquired rightly and justly, so Zacchaeus knew he needed to correct those wrongs also.

In essence, one "look" from Our Blessed Lord to a heart open to joy, completely converted this man, who though short in stature, became immense in the eyes of Christ. We are told in the face of "grumbles from the crowd" Zacchaeus stood firm. Christ told him clearly that salvation had come to his household. No man could ask for more. We can imagine that this man became a confident disciple of Jesus.

This gospel asks us are we willing to make "eye contact" with Jesus perhaps by staring at a crucifix in prayer or at a sacred painting or in the deep recesses of our heart? Are we willing to be "surprised by joy"? The joy may startle you because it may lead to a conversion of life from what you know at present, to something you can hardly imagine. It could be a sharing of your wealth, a change of career that brings you ever closer to God or a renewal of a friendship where faith is a part.

May Our Lord help you rise up like Zacchaeus, come quickly and follow Him with joy, wherever He may bring you.

Grand Annual Letter, October 2022

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

May the grace and love of Jesus Christ be with you!

I give thanks to my God at every remembrance of you, praying always with joy in my every prayer for all of you, because of your partnership for the gospel from the first day until now. Phil 1: 3-5

St. Paul speaks of how important it is for all of us to join in friendship and commitment to our calling to spread the message of joy, peace, and trust in all the Lord offers us. I thank God for the many manifestations of God's grace in our Catholic Weymouth Collaborative. After two challenging years, both in our community and in the wider Church, our partnership in the gospel has shown signs of flourishing in the Lord's work.

We have grown in our parish as evidenced by the bringing of new life into our community through the sacrament of baptism. Our baptisms doubled at Immaculate Conception in 2021 and have increased almost as much at Saint Jerome. This indicates a renewed vibrancy in our parish family. In the recent decade, you have read that the celebration of Catholic marriages has fallen considerably. In both our parishes, we have experienced a significant growth in the joyous celebration of marriage. Our Lord is blessing us with families who understand that a graced family life begins when Our Blessed Lord is an active partner in the beginning of a young couple's life together.

Along with these wonderful signs of the Lord's action among us, we continue to explore new ways to meet the needs of our young families and youth. Through our Religious Formation program, we seek to engage parents and children on spiritual and social levels, offering opportunities for fun and dynamic faith sharing, over games and food. We have made many improvements in our buildings to allow for an ease of use for community events, celebrations and enhanced educational opportunities for adults and youth, most notably the renovation of Saint Paula Hall at Saint Jerome and the addition of Air Conditioning and heating units at the Msgr. Hackett Center at Immaculate Conception. The renovation of a much-needed room for use by Youth Ministry is also underway at the Msgr. Hackett Center.
