

BLESSED ARE WE WHO HEAR THE CALL TO THE MOUNT OF CALVARY



The Sermon on the Mount is often looked upon as the first act of the drama of Christ's life with the second act being the Mount of Calvary. None of us can hear the words from the Mount of the Beatitudes without putting them into our hearts, realizing this way of living will draw the wrath of the world and lead us straight to the crucifixion on Mount Calvary.

The Pharisees and the Romans may as well have brought the hammers and nails to the grassy plain, as they laid out their objections to this Jesus from Nazareth. Blessed are the poor in spirit; rubbish! We are in this world to gather riches, popularity and fame. Blessed are they who mourn; we live for pleasure and ignore those who are suffering as burdens. Blessed are the peacemakers; war promotes economies and serves at the altar of power. Who is this man, Jesus, telling us, blessed are the clean of heart? We much rather enjoy the pleasures of the flesh, able to objectify and use one another at will. Is he a fool to promote such "soft" virtues of patience, meekness, love, peace?

Jesus invited the people on that glorious day to infiltrate the powers of self indulgence, hate, and moral decadence with love. He asked the people to endure one another's injuries and insults: to write a letter of kindness to a mean co-worker, to offer a gift to someone who might steal from you, to repay an offense with a gracious word. The only way to stop hate is to infect the person with love, to act with the cure. Christ was the cure from the cross and his blood and water flowed directly from the cross into our woundedness. How magnificently contradictory, and how like Christ, that a dead man, soon to rise, became the means of salvation for all of humanity! The Beatitudes are like the cross, they speak to the culture from the opposite side of the road, and by doing so, they are a bridge for salvation. They teach us how to have the mindset of Christ, a mind that does not see the world the way the world sees itself. The Beatitudes put us on high moral ground, a grounding that does not proclaim the gospel of the strong but a gospel of the patient, the peacemaker, the humble, the merciful, the marginalized, whose reward will not be presented at an earthly banquet, but will be enjoyed with Jesus, Our Lord at the heavenly table. Blessed are we who hear the call to Calvary!

In my parents' bedroom there were on the wall two photos of my mom and dad from their early adulthoods. The photo of my mother entranced me when I was a boy. I loved looking at it, even though I saw her in daily life. Something about that picture captured her perfectly. It was an image of the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength that enveloped me from the start of my life. It was an icon of the woman who fed, taught, and encouraged me. I felt a deep pride that I came from such beauty.



The beatitudes of Jesus are a kind of self-portrait. But it is a strange picture.

At first, the blessings of being poor, mourning, and hungering and thirsting for righteousness may seem bizarre or, worse, a religious delusion. Who wants to look like *that*? But if we look again, we begin to see the characteristics of Jesus' form. He becomes poor and fills it with his riches for us, he weeps and mourns for us, and fills it with his joy, he hungers and thirsts for us to be righteous, and so satisfies us. And so on. It's the way he appears on the cross.

Perhaps we should put on our bedroom room walls the words of the beatitudes next to a crucifix of the Lord Jesus. Then we can do what the beatitudes are designed for, to gaze at the joy, wisdom, beauty, and strength of the one who is our origin, and who is with us every day. And little by little, we'll start to look like him.

Who may come?

Any baptized adult who has received First Communion but who has postponed the reception of Confirmation is invited to attend. Please note that the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary to be a godparent at baptism and recommended for service in many church ministries. This sacrament is also highly recommended for those preparing for the Sacrament of Marriage.

***A baptized Catholic, if married, is expected to be validly married in the Church prior to receiving Confirmation. Any questions regarding marriages, please consult your parish priest/deacon before registering

What will the course be like?

The course will introduce the adult learner to major aspects of the Catholic faith through the study of the mass which includes reflection on the sacraments, the Creed, prayer and the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit essential to live the moral Christian life. The six weeks will be a chance to ask questions and move forward in faith.

Very little is actually known about this early Christian martyr. The first reference we have of St. Blaise is in the medical journals of a court physician, from the end of the fifth or beginning of the sixth century, where St. Blaise is mentioned as being called upon for treating objects stuck in the throat.

We also know that Blaise was the bishop of Sebaste in Armenia and suffered martyrdom under Licinius about AD 316. Supposedly, this early Christian martyr was born to noble and wealthy parents who provided him with a Christian education. He became a physician and was elected and consecrated a bishop at a young age. During the persecution of Licinius, a former ally of Constantine who began persecuting the Church, Blaise experienced a call to live as a hermit in a cave


outside of town, where he was known to heal sick and wounded wild animals. Eventually he was discovered by hunters. Blaise was taken to Agricolaus, the governor of Cappadocia and Lesser Armenia, and thrown into jail.

By the sixth century St. Blaise's intercession was being invoked in the east for illnesses related to the throat. By the ninth century, the saint was also revered in Europe and went on to become one of the most popular saints in the Middle Ages. In time, the custom of blessing the throats of the faithful developed, with priests holding two tapered candles — over the head or the throat while invoking the intercession of St. Blaise against any ailment of the throat and body.

While ailments of the throat are the main thing for which St. Blaise is invoked in the West, he is also considered a protector against wild animals, a protector of cities and a patron of veterinarians, wool-combers and the wool industry.
