



JOHN 10:1-10 JESUS, THE SHEPHERD AND DADS



"They will not follow a stranger, they will run away from him because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." St. John's gospel recounts the relationship between the shepherd and his sheep; it is a heartfelt bond where both recognize each other, the sheep hearing the sound of the voice of their leader calling them to safety and the Shepherd's voice being known above all other voices. Our Blessed Lord's voice calls us to freedom, hope, joy and courage.


As I was praying with this gospel a memory of a moment with of my Dad, who passed away in January 2022, came powerfully to me; it was a vivid memory of him being a Shepherd bringing me to safety.

I was in graduate school at Northeastern in the late 70's and I had a car (Toyota Corona Mark II) that was worse for the wear. One rainy evening on the expressway, in bumper to bumper traffic, the car died in the center lane. I was alone (pre cell phone days). The man behind me was so angry that he jumped from his car and told he was going to "push" me into the off ramp, where he left me. It was dark by now, so I walked from the ramp to a coffee shop to call home for advice. My Dad answered the phone and I said "Dad, I am alone here with a broken down car in an unfamiliar place." He just said "I am coming." I ordered a coffee, in a rather "sketchy coffee shop" and prepared to wait. I remember I received my coffee and I heard my Dad's voice behind me, saying, Mary. To this day the relief was beyond imaginable. He had come so quickly; it seemed that the Lord had brought him on a 40 minute journey in seconds. I often recall this moment as a moment when the Shepherd knowing his sheep came out. I was a sheep in an unfamiliar place, alone and needed help. As the Lord does for us, my Dad came immediately and brought safety and courage.

My Dad helped me get the car towed and repaired. This sounds just like the Lord; when we hear his voice he helps us to put our own lives in order, to right what may be wrong, to make better what is already on the right path. The Good Shepherd leads us to the gate which is eternal life and he does this by a gentle touch respecting our freedom and encouraging us to know him through Word and sacrament, so that we always hear his voice. My Dad was the father of nine kids and it was a difficult task, but when I needed him for advice and a safe haven in "trouble" he was present. I can still hear his voice. We are invited in the gospel to hear the Lord's voice as clear as we hear our loved ones for whoever listens and enters with the Shepherd will be saved, and will come in and go out and find joy, peace and eternal life.

HISTORY OF THE HYMN - PART XXI

Be Not Afraid

Words adapted from Scripture, music by Robert J. Dufford (b. 1943)



At some point in our lives, we all are afraid. We fear physical harm, or emotional pain, such as the loss of a loved one or the challenges of a difficult personal relationship. We also fear the unknown, including the uncertainty of what the future holds. This was the case with songwriter Bob Dufford.

Dufford was studying to be a Jesuit priest at Saint Louis University in Missouri in 1972. As he prepared to be ordained, he had anxiety and concerns over his future role as priest, wondering if he could do his vocation well. It was suggested by his spiritual director that he pray while reflecting on the Annunciation; of Mary's invitation to serve the Lord by the angel Gabriel, and the doubts she must have had. Upon reading the words of that

scripture, he was struck by Gabriel's words, "Do not be afraid, which became the title of the song. Further words were inspired when he was told by a friend of her upcoming missionary trip to Ghana¹. Dufford thought of Matthew's gospel, where Jesus said, "I am with you always." This became "I go before you always." Also from the Book of Matthew, "Come follow me, and I will make you fishers of men" became "Come, follow me". That completed the chorus, or refrain. After being ordained, he was inspired to write the verses of the song in 1973. Some changes were needed; friend and fellow Jesuit (also a songwriter) John Foley suggested altering a section to be more prayerful in nature – thus, "you shall cross the desert" became "You shall cross the barren desert."

In 1975 the piece was published and distributed. Responses were gradual in coming but proved the piece was deeply meaningful to those who listened to it. One family prayed the Rosary and sang *Be Not Afraid* every day for an alcoholic father. Eventually he joined Alcoholics Anonymous. Others shared that they were comforted by it in times of grief.⁵ Other songs by Dufford are *Sing to the Mountains*, *Like a Shepherd* and *All the Ends of the Earth*.⁶

As you sing the words of this song, may you be comforted as a follower of Christ in whatever your fears and griefs: the Lord is with you!







