

How Would You Like to be the Main Supporting Actor in a Play?

How would you like to be the main supporting actor in a play?

The passage from Matthew's Gospel we hear today is quite the drama! There is both drama and tragedy, but also importantly being the ultimate Love Story. It is really a trilogy - a play in three acts and we are each called to play a key role in this play. Yes both you and me!

Now Act I takes place in ancient Israel where God has entered into a covenant of love with His people – first with his servant Noah, then with Abraham and then Moses. It is a covenant that no other people can claim they have with their gods. Our God says to his chosen people "I will be your God and you will be my people." This covenant of love will be constant and the people will flourish in a land flowing with milk and honey, a vineyard of the finest fruits.

But we know what happens! The people forget the covenant and worship idols to foreign gods, they neglect the poor and the stranger. As the play continues, God sends His servants the prophets to bring them back, but they are mistreated and they don't listen to God's warnings. Now in Act II – God the Father sends His own Son to collect what was rightfully due Him – simply the return of love from those who were the beneficiaries of God's love. Everything Jesus did in His public ministry – preaching, miracles, healings – all was intended to win back the love of the foolish tenants. And we know how Act II ends!

Jesus, the Suffering Servant, is betrayed, rejected, tortured and dies a horrific death on the Cross - the curtain for Act II closes. In the final part of the play - Act III – it is not the prophets that have a main role - this is where you and I are invited to begin our main supporting role as servants of God. We are now the servants sent by God to deliver all the love, devotion, commitment that is owed. Each of us is a ministering servant and like the prophets in Act I. I imagine at times we all have felt like those rejected servants – not appreciated, rejected by those who God sends us to. We have seen many plays where an actor is killed off in one scene and never heard from again.

As we continue our role as servants in Act III we must keep in mind that we are not alone in our ministry-we have Christ with us. With the eyes of faith we can experience something marvelous, something tremendous - Jesus is present in Act III as well. We are called to serve in such a way that those who see us, see Jesus as well. We are called to radiate the love of Christ as He works through us in our ministry. It doesn't matter if you are a member of the clergy, religious or a layperson, we all are called to this ministry by virtue of our Baptism.

If you only saw Acts I & II, you would think this play is a tragedy. But Act III, which is now, in the present, ongoing, is the greatest love story ever told and we are called by name to be main supporting actors. While Hollywood actors strive to receive fleeting awards such the Oscars, we strive to bring others to Christ and receive the award of eternal life with our loving God. Oscars are good, but being with God for eternity is much better. Play your part well!
