Saint Leo the Great

Roman deacon who advised two popes, Leo was elected pope in 440 while on a diplomatic mission to Gaul, now France. He is one of three popes called "the Great." His title was earned for his teachings, which are found in 143 letters and nearly 100 sermons that survive, and for his administration. Under his leadership, church governance was consolidated, the primacy of Rome stressed, and liturgical, pastoral, and canonical uniformity urged. He also persuaded Attila the Hun not to sack Rome. Leo the Great was named a Doctor of the Church for his contribution to Christian doctrine.
