

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

This coming week we celebrate the lives of three very important saints in the life of the Catholic Church. Tuesday, October 15<sup>th</sup> is the Memorial of Saint Teresa of Avila. She was born in Spain in 1515, and she was a member of the Carmelite Order. She suffered many illnesses throughout her life, and she was one of the great mystics in the Catholic Church. She wrote the Way of Perfection and the Interior Castle, classics in spirituality even today. In 1572, her spiritual development led to her "spiritual marriage," considered the highest level of mystical attainment. Teresa was also the recipient of the extraordinary piercing of the heart. The fact of this occurrence was proven after her death, when her heart was found to have been pierced. In 1970, she was the first woman declared to be a "Doctor of the Church," and she is frequently depicted in art with an arrow, book, or heart.

On Thursday, October 17th we celebrate the Memorial of Saint Ignatius of Antioch. He was one of the more famous martyrs in the early church (died in 107 AD), and he may have been a disciple of either Saint Peter or Saint Paul. One tradition declares that Ignatius was the child mentioned in Matthew 18:1-6 who was placed by Christ among the Apostles: "Jesus called a child over, placed it in their midst, and said, 'Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the Kingdom of Heaven' (Mt 18:2-3)." His martyrdom is well-chronicled. Arrested by Roman authorities, he was sent to Rome for execution. Along the way to Rome, Ignatius composed epistles to the Christian communities of Ephesus, Magnesia, Tralles, Rome, Philadelphia, and Smyrna. He was killed by being thrown to the wild beasts in the Roman Circus. Friday, October 18th is the Feast of Saint Luke, one of the four Gospel writers. It's also my dad's birthday (86 years young), and I wish him many blessings on his special day!
