

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate Priesthood Sunday when we remember all the men who give their lives to the ministerial priesthood and for those men who are discerning a vocation to the priesthood. There are currently 83 men in formation at Borromeo and Saint Mary Seminaries, 57 of whom are studying for the Diocese of Cleveland. Our Lady of Hope has one parishioner studying at Borromeo Seminary. Carlos Rojak is a freshman at Borromeo, and he will be giving a vocation talk at Our Lady of Hope and Saint Mary this weekend. We wish him well in his studies, and we pray that more young people in our parishes consider a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. When young Catholic men are asked why they haven't considered the priesthood, the number one reason given is that no one had ever asked them to. Living a life of simplicity and taking vows of obedience and celibacy is certainly countercultural in this day and age.

Of course, it was also countercultural for the Twelve Apostles to leave their families, occupations, and homes to follow Jesus. To embrace the radical call to discipleship is never easy. Being a faithful Catholic, let alone a priest, is hard but rewarding work. But we never do it alone. Jesus calls us, the Holy Spirit guides us, and our parish community encourages and supports us. Jesus Christ calls us to our individual vocations in a variety of ways, but typically it's not a "burning bush" experience. While theophanies can happen, Jesus uses his mystical body, the Church, to call people to discipleship and to all vocations. As members of that Mystical Body, we all have a role to play in fostering vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Father Isidore, Father Dennis, and I thank both parishes for your support in all our ministerial work. I also want to thank Sandy and Angelina Garganta for offering their time and talent as they begin their new role of Eucharistic minister at Our Lady of Hope. Both of them were commissioned at last weekend's 11:00 a.m. Mass.
