Please call the Parish Office (at 563-242-3311) to set up the training time. A fee of \$25 is to be paid by the couple being married to the person providing the training.**

**A non-parish soloist may sing music not sung by the cantor at your wedding.**

Prior to the Gospel, the Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia) and verse (from Respond and Acclaim) is to be sung. The acclamation begins when the reader sits down.

**NOTE:** *If there is only one reading selected instead of two, the verse of the Gospel Acclamation may be omitted. If there is only one reading, the Gospel Acclamation may be omitted.*

Following the Consent (vows), an Acclamation of Praise (the refrain of the Celtic Alleluia) is to be sung by the assembly.

After the Giving of Rings, quiet instrumental music may be played as the members of the wedding party return to their places. (The last half of the refrain of the Celtic Alleluia is played quietly.)

### IF MASS

At the time of the Offertory, a song sung by the assembly or a solo piece is appropriate. Instrumental music may also be played.
