A reflection on Gaudete Sunday from Msgr. Celano

There is a story told about St. Teresa of Calcutta who, one day, noticed one of her sister's looking particularly sad and weary as she was about to begin her day's work with the poor. Mother Teresa called her back. "What did Jesus say, Sister; to go ahead of him or to follow him?", Mother Teresa asked. The sister answered, "Jesus said, 'follow me', Mother." Mother Teresa responded, "Then why are you trying to get ahead of him? Go back into the chapel and pray. Do not leave to go out to your mission until you find your joy." Saints can be difficult people to live with. The sister did what Mother told her to do and discovered something in prayer: she didn't have to *find* a way to joy, but *follow* the way to joy. And that way to joy will always lead to the encounter with Jesus Christ, the Mercy of the Father made flesh.

John the Baptist knew this well. He is constantly pointing to Christ, who is both the path to joy and its' source. John calls us first to repentance, a change of heart and mind and deeds, because to follow on this path we must leave behind those things that diminish us, that threaten to rob us of our joy; we must leave our sin behind. As John often asserts in the Scriptures, he is not the savior – he is not the cause of our joy - but only his herald. John reminds us of a simple truth; we are not our own saviors. We must look to another. Yet, so often we act as if we are, mistakenly believing that we can win heaven if we're good enough...

It seems to me that somewhere along the way we have forgotten the essential message of the Gospel, the "good news", and it's this: we are sinners loved and saved by God's mercy. God does not love us when we are worthy. He loves us and this makes us worthy...


But what is this "mercy" that saves us? If we were lawyers, we would define it as "pardon", the dismissal of punishment due for a crime. In this sense, mercy is "undeserved forgiveness" since there is no question of guilt. We all are the recipients of "undeserved forgiveness". We are sinners, and "the Lord laid on Him the guilt of us all", as Isaiah says.

But the Father's mercy goes beyond simply pardoning our offenses. His mercy weeps tears of joy when His prodigal son comes home, it rejoices in finding the lost sheep, and is like the joy of the woman who finds her lost coin. The mercy of the Father is Jesus Christ; He is "the face of the Father's mercy" as Pope Francis tells us, the One who always searches for us and rejoices to lead us home.

In contemplating the face of Jesus, the face of the Father's Mercy, may we know the extraordinary grace offered to each of us; we are not our own saviors. He alone is! His is the path we follow to joy. His is the heart that must be shaped in us so that we too may be merciful, as the Father is merciful.

Teresa of Avila once exclaimed, "God save us from gloomy saints!" Joy is contagious, especially the joy that comes from the Gospel. We need to recover it for the sake of our mission and witness as a parish. So, let's take St. Teresa of Calcutta's advice and not get ahead of Jesus. Let's stay at His feet for a while until we find the way to joy...

NJ Tax Amnesty

Under new legislation, the Division of Taxation has been authorized to implement a tax amnesty program, providing tax payers and corporations with the opportunity to file past tax returns and/or pay back taxes along with reduced interest due as of Nov. 1, 2018.

Amnesty will only apply to outstanding tax filing or payments that are reportable on a tax return due on or after Feb. 1, 2009, and prior to Sept. 1, 2017.
