

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

On the weekend of July 27-28, Bishop Checchio issued a communication to the people of Mary, Mother of God Church in Hillsborough regarding the parish's former pastor, Liam Minogue. What occasioned this letter was the need to address the removing of Liam Minogue's name from the Parish Center building, which had previously been named after him. Since he also served as pastor of St. Peter the Apostle Church from 1981-1993, I believe it is important that the same information that was communicated to the people of Mary, Mother of God Church be communicated to you. After consulting with our Bishop, he agreed.

To date, three separate credible complaints of the sexual abuse of minors have been received by the Diocese of Trenton against Liam Minogue spanning more than a decade, specifically between the 1960s and 1970s. Based on the information contained in Bishop Checchio's letter, the alleged acts did not occur here at St. Peter or in any parish within the Diocese of Metuchen, but in other parishes and before the creation of our diocese.

To cite Bishop Checchio's letter, "In each of the complaints, the Diocese of Trenton determined credibility based on a thorough and deliberate process. Their Diocesan Review Board is an independent body from the Diocese of Trenton and its members serve as fact finders. Their review board consists of: two priests; the president of a high school; a former county prosecutor; a former county chief of detectives; a Ph.D. psychologist with expertise in abuse cases; a hospital chief medical officer; a former high school principal; an attorney who is a social services director; a licensed clinical social worker; and a Chief Administrative Officer. This board determined that these three complaints were believable,

plausible and reasonable, corroborated, and ultimately deemed credible. As a result of these findings, Liam Minogue's name was published as part of a list naming priests throughout the Diocese of Trenton who had credible complaints of abuse against them. Additionally, there is a pending fourth complaint from the 1970s being investigated by the Diocese of Trenton. All complaints have been reported to the appropriate County Prosecutor's offices."

Neither I nor the Bishop know anything more about these allegations other than what is contained above: that the Diocese of Trenton deemed there to be three credible complaints against Minogue regarding the sexual abuse of minors; that there are no known complaints beyond the four mentioned above; and there are no known complaints of abuse against Minogue after he became a priest of the Diocese of Metuchen or while he served as a pastor here at St. Peter. Again, to cite Bishop Checchio's letter, "These allegations only came to light in 2017, upon a survivor coming forward through an attorney. The Diocese of Trenton never received a complaint or knew of any complaints prior to 2017. The Diocese of Metuchen only just recently became aware of any complaint about Minogue through the Diocese of Trenton. Again, there are no known complaints regarding Minogue's conduct while a priest for the Diocese of Metuchen."

It distresses me to have to inform you of this since many people in our parish remember Liam Minogue fondly and respectfully. But it distresses me even more to consider the suffering of anyone devastated by the horrific acts of sexual abuse. The legacy of Liam Minogue, who passed away in 2007, has been eclipsed by this new information just now coming to light. We as

a parish must acknowledge it. Since it is not proper to honor any member of the clergy credibly accused of the sexual abuse of a minor, I am removing his portrait from the portraits of our previous pastors hanging in the parish hall. The purpose of this is to stand in support of survivors and to not subject them to an honor paid to someone credibly accused of abusing other survivors, similar to themselves.

I urge you to report any act of sexual abuse committed by a member of the clergy or religious or anyone to law enforcement. I also ask that you earnestly pray for the survivors of sexual abuse and those who care for them. Lastly, pray for our parish and for the effects this information may have on those who knew and respected Liam Minogue. I will make myself available to anyone who may wish to discuss these disturbing allegations and their effects with me privately and confidentially.

Let us remain vigilant in prayer for one another and in our efforts to protect the dignity and safety of every person, especially our children and those most vulnerable to exploitation and abuse.


