

HALLOWED BY THEY NAME

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" - Is 6:3

When we pray, "hallowed be thy name," we are not asking to make God holier; His holiness is perfect and unchanging. Rather, we ask that we might become a people who honor God more and more in our lives, our actions, and our world. This petition calls us to reflect on our relationship with God and how we live out His holiness in our daily lives.

The connection to Baptism is key, this petition reminds us of our baptismal promise to holiness and newness of life. St. Cyprian explains:

"By whom is God hallowed, since he is the one who hallows? But since he said, 'You shall be holy to me; for I the LORD am holy,' we seek and ask that we who were sanctified in Baptism may persevere in what we have begun to be. And we ask this daily, for we need sanctification daily, so that we who fail daily may cleanse away our sins by being sanctified continually.... We pray that this sanctification may remain in us" (CCC 2813).

This begins within ourselves. By praying "hallowed be thy name," we ask for compunction of heart - the grace to recognize how often we fail to honor God. We lament how cheaply we hold His name and take our relationship with Him for granted. Pope Francis reflects that as we contemplate what Christ has done for us, we cannot help but be confronted by our "bad habits, compulsions, attachments, weak faith, vain goals, and... the failure of our hearts to respond to the Lord's love and His plan for our lives." Yet this experience of contrition purifies us, leaving us "more desirous of God and less obsessed with ourselves" (Dilexit Nos, 158).

In addition to the personal, this petition has a missionary dimension as well. As the ancient writer Tertullian teaches this prayer is prayed for all the world:

"When we say 'hallowed be thy name,' we ask that it should be hallowed in us, who are in him; but also in others whom God's grace still awaits, that we may obey the precept that obliges us to pray for everyone, even our enemies. That is why we do not say expressly 'hallowed be thy name 'in us,' for we ask that it be so in all men" (CCC 2814).

This prayer unites us to the mission of the Church to bring God's sanctifying grace to all people. In a world that often forgets God, our prayer becomes a beacon of hope and reparation. We ask that where Jesus encounters hard and closed-off hearts, He may instead find in us hearts open to His transformative love. Like the Blessed mother and the saints when we open our hearts to God's love He is able to do great and beautiful things. We have only to look at the examples of saints like Mother Theresa or John Paul II to remember that the most potent force in the world is a heart set on fire with love for God. Pope Francis speaks about how good actions done by such hearts help to heal the wounds caused by sin, he says: it is through our "acts of fraternal love" that we "heal the wounds of the Church and of the world" (Dilexit Nos, 200).

By living this petition, we bring consolation to the heart of Christ and offer Him the joy of seeing His holiness reflected in our lives. Let us pray with renewed fervor that God's name may be hallowed in us and in all the world.
