

Message from the Pastor

December 29, 2019

Epiphany Party, Jan. 10, p. 11 | Happy New Year!

Dear Friends in Christ:

Quí Ông Bà và Anh Chị Em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô: Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family, the title given to this family unit: the Divine Son of God Jesus who became man, His mother the Virgin Mary and His foster-father Joseph. Devotion to the Holy Family grew in popularity in the 17th century. Several religious congregations were founded under this title. On October 26, 1921, Pope Benedict XV added this feast day to the Church's calendar for the Sunday after Epiphany. Prior to 1921, this feast was celebrated only regionally. Popes before Benedict XV, especially Leo XIII, promoted this feast as a way to counteract the breakdown of the family. Interesting that 100 years ago people were concerned about the family. We are still concerned about the family today. In 1969, the feast was moved to the Sunday after Christmas. If Christmas falls on a Sunday, then it falls on the Monday after Christmas, Dec. 26th.

We know very little about the life of the Holy Family through the Gospels. We hear of the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, his circumcision and presentation in the temple, fleeing to Egypt due to King Herod's order to kill every boy under the age of two; losing the 12 year old Jesus and finding Him in the Temple (lack of effective communication between Mary and Joseph, thinking Jesus was with the other parent). For 30 years of His life that is all that is recorded in the Gospels. The Holy Family experienced the many joys and challenges that all families encounter.

The Feast of the Holy Family is not just about the Holy Family, but about our own families too. The main purpose of the Feast is to present the Holy Family as the model for all Christian families. Mary and Joseph had to learn to be good parents, just like you as parents must learn to do so. Hopefully, we have had good role model parents (but not all do unfortunately) who help you in parenting your own children. But even then, every parent will experience trials and errors, and what may work for one child will not work for a different child. There is no instruction manual given to you with the birth of a child, though there are books available that offer wisdom. Plus, children need to learn how to respond appro-

priately to parents, by respecting and honoring parents and assisting at home, just as Jesus had to grow up and learn how to help His mother and Joseph around the house and assist Joseph in his carpentering trade.

Our family life becomes sanctified when we live the life of the Church within our homes. This is called the "domestic church" or the "church in miniature." St. John Chrysostom (349-407) urged all Christians to make each home a "family church," and in doing so, we sanctify the family unit. In the document *Lumen Gentium* #11 (Constitution of the Church) of Vatican II, it states: "The family, is so to speak, the domestic church." Pope John Paul II elaborated much on the domestic church in his teachings.

Just how does one live out the Church in the family? The best way is by making Christ the center of family and individual life. Ways to do this include: reading scripture regularly, praying daily, attending Mass as a family on Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation, imitating the actions of the Holy Family, working and praying as a family both at home and at church, etc., all done together as a family unit.

January 1st is a holy day of *obligation*, Mary, Mother of God. The schedule is on p. 7. All Marian feasts reflect a truth more about Jesus than Mary. The title, Mother of God, reflects the truth that the Son of God, one divine Person with two natures both divine & human, was born in time by Mary. Cf. p. 8. We also pray for world peace and how we are to live in peace respecting the dignity of every human being.

Come and pray for families, as well as all holy vocations but especially to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life on this First Thursday with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament on Jan. 2nd. Cf. p. 8. Normally, we have Exposition also on the first Friday of the month, but we have cancelled both Exposition (6:30 pm-8 pm) & the 8 pm Mass on Jan. 3rd.

Save the Date: Friday, Jan. 10—a parish Epiphany party. Everyone is invited to come together & enjoy one another in our parish hall. Cf. p. 11. Save the date for our pre-Lenten Mission, Monday-Wednesday, Feb. 17-19. Cf. p. 10.



SOLEMNITY OF MARY, MOTHER OF GOD JANUARY 1

Mary's divine motherhood broadens the Christmas spotlight. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38). Elizabeth proclaims: "Most blessed are you among women and blessed is the *fruit of your womb*. And how does this happen to me, that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" (Luke 1:42-43, emphasis added). Mary's role as mother of God places her in a unique position in God's redemptive plan.

Without naming Mary, Paul asserts that "God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law" (Galatians 4:4). Paul's further statement that "God sent the spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying out 'Abba, Father!" helps us realize that Mary is mother to all the brothers and sisters of Jesus.

Some theologians also insist that Mary's motherhood of Jesus is an important element in God's creative plan. God's "first" thought in creating was Jesus. Jesus, the incarnate Word, is the one who could give God perfect love and worship on behalf of all creation. As Jesus was "first" in God's mind, Mary was "second" insofar as she was chosen from all eternity to be his mother.

The precise title "Mother of God" goes back at least to the third or fourth century. In the Greek form *Theotokos*—God-bearer—it became the touchstone of the Church's teaching about the Incarnation. The Council of Ephesus in 431 insisted that the holy Fathers were right in calling the holy virgin *Theotokos*. At the end of this particular session, crowds of people marched through the street shouting: "Praised be the *Theotokos*!" The tradition reaches to our own day. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, Vatican II's *Dogmatic Constitution on the Church* calls Mary "Mother of God" 12 times.





For repair of Church marble floors?

A) \$25,108 B) \$36,495 C) \$41,602 D) \$43,887

Recently, we had the entire Church marble floors repaired for chips & cracks and were cleaned & polished. The polish shine for the floor level throughout the Church is considered a honed finish (less shiny) as compared to a high polished finish in the inner (altar) sanctuary. Why the difference? Though I prefer the look of the high polished finish, we were told the honed finish is more appropriate for high traffic areas since it is less slippery and safer for the general public.

Unfortunately, our beautiful marble floors have not been holding up as well as we expected. The marble contractor / installers cannot give us a reason why. We understand the floors need to be cleaned & polished, but we are not pleased with all the chips & cracks forming. In 2011, we spent \$34,557 on repairs & cleaning. In 2013, we spent \$9,000. In 2014, we spent \$20.313. Adding \$41.302 of what we spent this fall, we have spent an amazing grand total of \$105,472 on the floors. Answer: C) \$41,602 spent in 2019 alone
