Message From Deacon John Carrara

July 26, 2020

Dear Friends in Christ:

Quí Ông Bà và Anh Chị Em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô: Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

Fr. Jeff is finishing up the last few days of his retreat / mini-vacation and so he asked me to compose a few words to go with the year-end financial information we are providing in this week's digital bulletin. Fr. Jeff will be back with his regular letter next week.

We just completed our financial year on June 30th and moved into a new financial year with a new budget. Like many other parishes in the Archdiocese, we had a challenging year. Depressed oil prices and the fallout from the Covid-19 virus and its effect on the local economy were evident in our financial results for the year. We finished the year with collections down \$220,000 from the previous year, resulting in a \$136,000 budget shortfall. The decrease in regular collections was partially offset by several generous special gifts, one of which was \$100,000. Securing a \$181,000 SBA Paycheck Protection Loan also made it possible to pay our employees during the Covid-19 shutdown and partial reopening.

In addition to meeting our normal operating expenses, we had to deal with major maintenance issues in the Cathedral Church last year. Cleaning the limestone exterior, repairing and restoring the marble flooring, repairing the roof and replacing the water line that feeds the fire safety sprinkler system cost us approximately \$100,000 during the year. We anticipate that we will continue to have to deal with maintenance and repair issues at the church, some routine and others that result from the original design decisions and construction execution. The repair of the paving and landscape damage incurred by repairing the damaged water line remains to be completed and paid for and we are dealing with a serious issue with one of the air conditioning chillers that feed the Cathedral Church.

As we look ahead to the coming year and our new budget, there **are** some bright spots. On the expense side of the budget we have a reduction in property insurance premiums, the temporary suspension of the required payments into the Archdiocesan Disaster Reserve Fund, and a modification to our Archdiocesan loan agreement. All of this amounts to a reduction of approximately \$450,000 in expenditures over the coming financial year. Our loan agreement has been converted to one that does not require principal payments every month, only interest payments at a very reasonable interest rate. As our financial situation improves over time we will resume principal payments as we are able.

As you can see from the financial presentation in this bulletin, our budget for the 2020-2021 financial year has expenses exactly equaling income. There is **no** surplus for emergencies! Major maintenance projects will probably have to be funded from our modest savings (\$239,000).

Obviously, the major element in the accuracy of this budget is our income projections. We conservatively estimated collections to be down 15% from last year's actuals and, unlike last year's experience, we only projected special gifts to be at a level more in line with historical results. Facility rentals at the church and Cathedral Centre are also a significant source of income. Weddings and wedding receptions were down year over year and many weddings have been rescheduled because of the pandemic. We have lowered our expectations for facility rental income for the coming year.

We have been fortunate that so many have begun contributing electronically through Faith Direct and PayPal even though they could not be physically present at Mass. Others have consistently mailed in their contributions in their physical absence. Still facing the unknown for the coming year and when things might return to normal, it is more important now than ever before that you continue to support the parish through your regular giving. Many have stopped their regular giving since they are not physically attending Mass. I realize that some have faced financial hardship because of the economic effects of the Coronavirus. I urge those who are able to give but are not doing so please start.

We will be closely monitoring our weekly contributions and will continue to report results on a weekly basis. We continue to look for ways to reduce expenses in the coming year, fully aware that we may have to take more drastic steps in the coming months in order to meet our obligations.





Notes on Other Income & Interest

- Other income includes an Archdiocesan cost-sharing of \$420,000, facilities usage fees & other gifts.
- Interest represents earnings on deposits in the Archdiocesan savings & loan account.

Notes on Expenses

- Ministries include all expenses related to Evangelization and Faith Formation, Sacramental Programs, Liturgy, Music & Parish Social Services.
- Clergy includes all expenses associated with the priests, deacons & rectory.
- Administration includes all expenses associated with operations of the parish office, primarily personnel, equipment & supplies.
- Plant Operation includes all expenses associated with the maintenance & repair of all parish facilities & utilities (electricity, gas, water, telephone, internet).
- Archdiocesan Obligations include the Cathedraticum tax (10% of most income) which is assessed on every parish for the administration of the Archdiocese.
- Capital Expenditures include all loan principal & interest payments. A modified loan agreement with the Archdiocese will result in a decrease of approximately \$350,000 in cash outflow for the new year.
- Property Insurance includes assessments for the Church / bell tower, Cathedral Centre, rectory, & older vacant buildings. Liability Insurance covers all activities on parish property.
- The health insurance costs the parish pays for our employees has increased. Beginning July 1, 2020 our medical costs for employees increased by 5% with dental insurance premiums remaining the same.
- Required payments into a disaster fund have been suspended.
- Property Insurance Premiums have decreased by \$56,4216 for the new budget year for a total of \$236,996.
- The Cathedraticum Tax (10% of most income) paid to the Archdiocese has increased by almost \$8,300 for the new budget year.
- There are no staff salary for the new financial year.

Palabras del Papa Francisco

El Reino de Dios

El Reino de Dios se hace presente en la persona misma de Jesús. Él es el tesoro escondido, es Él la perla de gran valor. Se comprende la alegría del campesino y del comerciante: ¡lo han encontrado! Es la alegría de cada uno de nosotros cuando descubrimos la cercanía y la presencia de Jesús en nuestra vida. Una presencia que transforma la existencia y nos hace abiertos a las exigencias de los hermanos; una presencia que invita a acoger a cada una de las demás presencias, incluso la del extranjero y del inmigrante.

Es una presencia acogedora, es una presencia alegre, es una presencia fecunda: así es el reino de Dios dentro de nosotros. Ustedes podrían preguntarme: ¿Cómo se encuentra el reino de Dios? Cada uno de nosotros tiene un itinerario especial, cada uno de nosotros tiene su camino en la vida. Para alguno el encuentro con Jesús es algo esperado, deseado, buscado por largo tiempo, como nos lo muestra la parábola del comerciante que da vueltas por el mundo para encontrar algo de valor. Para otros ocurre de forma improvisa, casi por casualidad, como en la parábola del campesino. Esto nos recuerda que Dios se deja encontrar de una manera o de otra, porque es Él el primero que desea encontrarnos y el primero que busca encontrarnos: vino para ser el «Dios con nosotros». Jesús está entre nosotros, Él está aquí hoy. Lo dijo Él: cuando se reúnen en mi nombre, yo estoy entre ustedes. El Señor está aguí, está con nosotros, está en medio de nosotros. Es Él quien nos busca, es Él quien se deja encontrar incluso por quien no lo busca. A veces Él se deja encontrar en sitios insólitos y en momentos inesperados. Cuando encontramos a Jesús quedamos fascinados, conquistados, y es una alegría dejar nuestro acostumbrado modo de vivir, tal vez árido y apático, para abrazar el Evangelio, para dejarnos quiar por la lógica nueva del amor y del servicio humilde y desinteresado. La Palabra de Jesús, el Evangelio. Debemos tener el Evangelio entre las manos, sobre la mesilla, en la cartera, en el bolsillo y abrirlo para leer la Palabra de Jesús: así viene el reino de Dios. El contacto con la Palabra de Jesús nos acerca al reino de Dios.
