RECTOR'S LETTER

October 3, 2021 Month of the Rosary

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:

Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

Legend has it that the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to St. Dominic in a vision and presented him with the Holy Rosary as a form of devotional prayer. While most now doubt the historical accuracy of this legend, there is no doubt that members of the Dominican Order (Order of Preachers) helped in the formation and promotion of this wonderful devotion. It was varied in form during its first several centuries but developed to its present form in the 16th century.

In 1571, the rosary took on heightened significance as Pope Pius V asked the troops of the Holy League (an alliance of the Papal States with Spain and Genoa to repel the incursions of the Ottoman Turks) as well as Christians throughout Europe to pray the rosary in preparation for the Battle of Lepanto. Against all odds, on October 7 the Christian naval forces achieved a stunning and complete victory over the Turkish fleet that was threatening to invade Europe and had sights on the conquest of Rome. Following this victory and deliverance of Christian Europe from the danger of the invading forces, Pope Pius V established October 7 as the feast of Our Lady of Victory—a celebration which now exists on our liturgical calendar as the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary.

In fact, the entire month of October now carries a theme of the rosary for Catholic devotion. While it may not always be for a reason as dramatic as praying for a dramatic military victory, the Catholic faithful have found great comfort and power in the praying over the rosary for centuries. What is perhaps most misunderstood about the devotion, though, is that while the prayers of the rosary have a distinctive Marian character, the rosary is actually a Christocentric prayer. The repetition of the prayers are not about a multiplication of prayers but are about establishing a rhythm allowing contemplation.

At the heart of the praying of the rosary is the prayerful contemplation of the Mysteries of Christ. As one falls into the rhythm of reciting the prayers and moving the beads, one is centered to contemplate the particular mystery of the decade through

intercession of Blessed Mary, who always aids us in pondering the mysteries of her Son who "kept all these things, pondering them in her heart." (Luke 2:19)

As many people struggle with unstructured prayer, the rosary has been of powerful aid for so many Catholics in finding a structured method for daily prayer. Throughout this month of October, I invite all the faithful to turn renewed attention to this beautiful tradition and to find assistance from the Blessed Virgin Mary in the seeking of the glory of her Son.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, we place all our trust in You. Amen.






