Archbishop Joseph Fiorenza Plaza Project Update

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:

Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

On the weekend of February 25-26, the First Sunday of Lent, I announced the plans for the construction of the Archbishop Joseph Fiorenza Plaza. Following the death of Archbishop Fiorenza this fall, I have been in discussion with Cardinal DiNardo and Archdiocesan leadership about bringing to fulfillment the late Archbishop's master plans for the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart.

The first phase of this project begins with the demolition of the old Sacred Heart church, which will begin shortly. You will start to see equipment this week as asbestos abatement begins in anticipation of the actual demolition. We are proceeding with an aggressive project plan in hopes that the entire project might (and for anyone who has been involved in construction projects, "might" is the key word) be completed by Christmas.

This will be part of a greater campaign that will be shared with parish and Archdiocese by summer, but even as plans are designed and funding raised, the demolition of the church must prepare the way. This is being accomplished by means of a substantial grant from the Archdiocese to help us get started.

During this time of construction, there will be short term disruption of parking. Following Easter, the primary parking lot across the street from the Co-Cathedral will range from partially to completely unavailable. In addition to street parking and parking in the Cathedral Centre lot, we are making arrangements to have the Chancery lot (immediately behind the Co-Cathedral) available even during weekdays as it is throughout the Lenten season each year. Additionally, Amegy Bank is cooperating with us in making their parking garage more available during weekends and key weeknights. Please be patient with us as we squeeze for a little while in order to expand and increase capacity.

Many have also inquired about bricks and other sentimental keepsakes from the old church as well as special opportunities to donate—details about these matters will be shared at a future date, but for now I will simply say that there will indeed be opportunities for all of these things. We want to enshrine the memory and story of our past while paving the way towards a bright future.

+ FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT +

Laetare! Rejoice! Today’s chipper **introit** may seem out of place in Lent: *Rejoice, O Jerusalem; and gather round, all you who love her; rejoice in gladness, after having been in sorrow; exult and be replenished with the consolation flowing from her motherly bosom.* Yet the messages in the Lenten Propers have alternated between crying out and receiving strength for the journey.

Psalm 23 in the Liturgy of the Word provides familiar reassurance, as does a favorite musical setting of this text, **The Lord is My Shepherd by John Rutter** (b. 1945). This work is juxtaposed with the introit’s psalm verse from **Psalm 122: I was glad when they said unto me let us go to the house of the Lord** (and a famous setting of this was voiced at the dedication of our Pasi Organ.) The psalm’s joy in rallying the folks to obedient motion, intensifies the musical peak of Rutter’s Psalm 23, *I will dwell in the house of the Lord.* Here is yet another glimpse of brief mountaintop glory this Lent.

While we rejoice to be in this house, being here comes with challenge. Music at the Offertory, **Wash Me Thoroughly by Samuel Sebastian Wesley** examines Psalm 51’s image of washing away our sins, as Jesus did literally for **the blind man** in today’s Gospel. (Was he the poor one lifting his eyes in last week’s **introit Oculi Mei?**) The melodies Wesley writes for Psalm 51 are difficult to sing. Wesley uses chromaticism and the previously forbidden melodic **tritone**, the interval symbolizing the devil in centuries of music theory, for the words *sin, faults, wickedness*. He then uses the baroque form of a **fugue** in **For I acknowledge my faults**. In a fugue, separate voices build and interlock at different times, which indeed present a web for God to untangle. A composer traditionally used a fugue to express gravitas. Perhaps there is some personal breast-striking here, too, as Samuel Sebastian’s father lived under some social stigma. However, a convert to Catholicism, Wesley’s father was the composer critical to the revival of sacred music from **Johann Sebastian Bach** in England. Like his namesake Johann Sebastian had done, Samuel Sebastian skillfully spells the name of **B-A-C-H** in musical notes for the tenor AND bass melodies for **Wash me** under the last alto subject, *Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness*. This can’t be an accident! What does it mean? Well, J. S. Bach himself was known to use this cryptogram. German musicologist H. H. Eggebrecht stipulates its incomplete feeling was Bach’s **statement of faith**: “I am identified with the tonic and it is my desire to reach it... **I am in need of salvation; I am certain in the hope of salvation.**” **If you don’t identify B-A-C-H in the moment, it is ok. This device is a structural construction that we just value knowing – akin to the solid walls of our cathedral.

After these many angstful devices, the choir’s text at the offertory aligns into a final plea for forgiveness. When the sopranos leap, one can almost see hands reached to heaven then falling to the ground in despair, and the final **all my sin** is the bottom of a descending octave. Similar feelings are evoked in the organ voluntaries today. Georg Böhm’s **Vater Unser** and Felix Mendelssohn’s **Fugue from Sonata VI** are both based on a melody for the Lord’s Prayer. *Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive.*



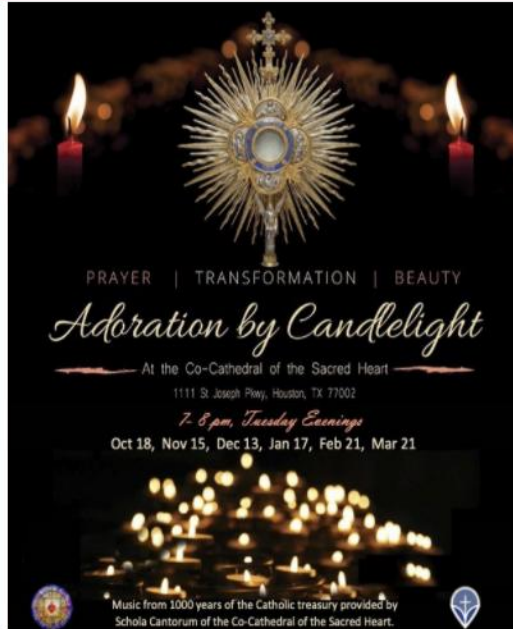

La mayor parte de nuestra información sobre San José procede de los dos primeros capítulos del Evangelio de San Mateo. Los Evangelios no recogen ninguna palabra suya; era el hombre "silencioso". No encontramos devoción a San José en la Iglesia primitiva. Fue voluntad de Dios que el

Nacimiento Virginal de Nuestro Señor fuera lo primero en grabarse firmemente en la mente de los fieles. Más tarde fue venerado por los grandes santos de la Edad Media. Pío IX (1870) lo declaró patrono y protector de la familia universal de la Iglesia.

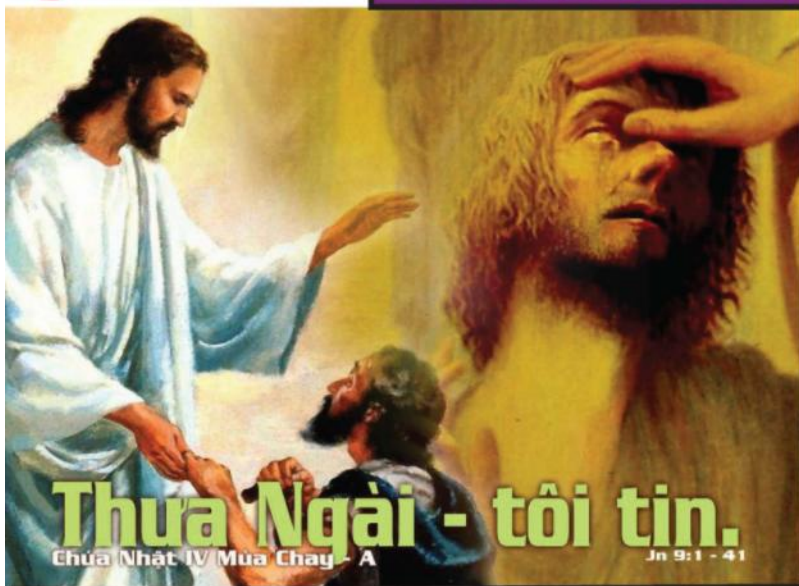



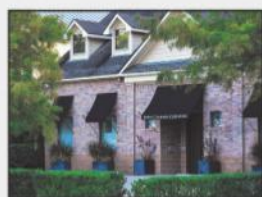
