May 7, 2023 Milestones

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:

On Wednesday, representatives from parishes across the Archdiocese gathered at the Co-Cathedral for a special Mass with Cardinal DiNardo closing the 175th Anniversary celebration for the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. We were represented by our clergy and some members of the Pastoral Council. Others from across the Archdiocese were able to gather at the special anniversary gala held at the Hilton Americas in late April where we looked not only at the history of our local church but also acknowledged some of the key leaders and legacies in our midst.

Milestones are important for recognition because they not only allow for looking back to origins but for a reminder in the present of who we are, where we come from, and where we are called to go. The legacy of the church of Galveston-Houston is in fact the legacy of the church in Texas, dating back to the establishment of the Diocese of Galveston on May 4, 1847, which at that time encompassed all of the current state of Texas and significant territory beyond the modern borders.


Our parish's part of that story began in 1896 when Sacred Heart was established as the fifth parish in Houston. In 1959, when Pope John XXIII established Houston itself as an episcopal see and redesignated the Diocese of Galveston as the Diocese of Galveston-Houston, the humble Sacred Heart parish church became a co-cathedral alongside St. Mary's Cathedral Basilica in Galveston. The original church, school, and rectory were all eventually replaced by the structures standing on the original property now, which are in the process of being demolished themselves. Our current beautiful Co-Cathedral church was dedicated on April 2, 2008 and is celebrating its 15th anniversary this year (how time flies!).

Aside from remembering origins, history, and mission, milestones also give us the opportunity to stop and pause in gratitude. Too often, we get caught up in the events of the present in a granular, episodic manner and lose sight of the overall picture. As the author Tom Clancy once said, "The good old days are now." We have had a lot of good days in the past for which we should pause and give thanks. But we should also remember that the good old days are happening right now if we can be present to the Lord and one another and live lives of perpetual gratitude.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, we place all our trust in you! Amen!

+ FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER +

Today's Introit, **Cantate Dómino**, comes from Psalm 98. Our motet during Holy Communion, by Italian baroque composer **Giuseppe Pitoni**, takes its text from another psalm which starts exactly the same way: Psalm 149. The Introit and Offertory antiphon (the latter not heard today) are full of rejoicing, which is reflected in today's hymnody, but the Gospel reading and Communion antiphon are more meditative; from Christ's "Farewell Discourse" at the Last Supper, these texts invite us to reflect on our trust in Christ. **John Ireland's** deeply affecting opus **Greater Love Hath No Man**, heard at the Offertory, takes part of its text from today's second reading. Note how throughout the anthem, Ireland quickly changes between both of the "moods" we are exploring today.


PARISH LIFE





2. Ý nghĩa của Hoa kính dâng Mẹ:

Các nhà thờ thường hay tổ chức dâng hoa kính Mẹ, lúc này, mỗi màu hoa lại tượng trung cho một nỗi lòng của con cái muốn dâng lên Mẹ, hay ca ngợi một nhân đức nào đó của Mẹ. Như vậy, Hoa biểu trưng cho lòng Mẹ và cũng là biểu trưng của lòng con người:

Hoa trắng chỉ sự trong sạch của tâm hồn.

Hoa tím chỉ sự tuân phục thánh ý Chúa.

Hoa vàng chỉ đức mến vẹn toàn.

Hoa xanh chỉ sự trọn lành thánh thiện.

Hoa đỏ chỉ sự hy sinh hãm mình.


