RECTOR'S CORNER

November 26, 2023
Ends & Beginnings

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:

Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

Each year, the Solemnity of Christ the King marks the last Sunday of the liturgical year before a new year begins on the First Sunday of Advent. Yet we discover that one seamlessly flows into the other. November's focus on matters of eternity flows right into the anticipation of the Lord's second coming in early Advent before the anticipatory spirit shifts to that of the coming in the flesh at Christmas.

In the same way, even as we mark the end of a liturgical year, we have new things beginning. It has been a few weeks since I have commented on the Completing the Walk campaign and the Archbishop Joseph A. Fiorenza Plaza, but there is indeed news to share on the latter front.

In terms of the campaign, contributions and pledges continue to come in. We had a bit of a hiatus on meetings with potential large gift donors, but those will be hopefully resuming soon. Nonetheless, we are just shy of \$7 million pledged with almost \$5 million of that already given. We continue to move the needle towards our \$9.8 million baseline goal.

The bigger news regards the construction of the Plaza. The permitting process with the City of Houston took longer than we had hoped, which led to a revision of our project schedule, which had originally targeted completion by the end of 2023. This is why after the rapid demolition process, you have seen little activity on the old church site over the last couple of months.

However, our wait is over as our site development permit has been approved, allowing for the beginning of work on the site. At the time of the writing of this letter (November 16—Thanksgiving requires an early deadline for our publisher!), the hope is that site work will commence this upcoming week (the week of November 27). Construction schedules can be a little bit unpredictable/variable as they are weather-sensitive, but our goal is to have use of the new parking area (if not the entire development) by Holy Week. Time will tell if we can succeed here, but most importantly, progress can now resume.

As we have just celebrated Thanksgiving, let me once again thank everyone who has supported the campaign. As we begin a new liturgical year, I look forward to Completing the Walk together!



PARISH LIFE



CHÚA NHẬT XXXIV- LỄ CHÚA KI-TÔ VUA _TN_NĂM A



Trong những ngày cuối cùng của năm phụng vụ, Giáo Hội cho chúng ta nhìn lại những giá trị của thời cảnh chung. Đặc biệt hôm nay, Giáo Hội nhắc nhớ chúng ta về Vương Quyền của Đức Giêsu Kitô, cũng như mối tương quan giữa hành vi của chúng ta với Vương Quyền ấy. Xin cho chúng ta luôn xác tín rằng chỉ có Nước của Cha là bền vững và đem lại hạnh phúc trường cửu cho chúng ta. Xin cho chúng ta biết chuẩn bị ngay từ đời này những gì cần thiết, để xứng đáng được vào Vương Quyền vĩnh cửu của Cha.

Đôi nét về Lễ Chúa Ki-Tô Vua

Vào năm 1922, khi Đức Pio XI, vị Giáo hoàng thứ 259 của Giáo hội Rôma được bầu chọn và bắt đầu sứ vụ mục tử hoàn vũ, thì phần lớn thế giới vẫn đang trong tình trạng hỗn loạn của giai đoạn vừa kết thúc Thế chiến thứ I (1914-1918). Đức Pio XI nhận ra rằng khi ủng hộ lối sống bị chi phối bởi chủ nghĩa thế tục, lợi thế vật chất, và hy vọng hão huyền do các bạo chúa tạo ra, dân chúng đang dần phủ nhận Chúa Kitô. Năm 1925, Đức Pio XI tổ chức Năm thánh trọng thể đánh dấu 1.600 năm Công đồng Nicaea. Trong suốt Năm Thánh, Đức Pio XI không ngừng nhấn mạnh đến Vương quyền của Chúa Kitô như được tuyên xưng trong Kinh tin kính: "Nước Người sẽ không bao giờ cùng". Vào ngày 11.12.1925 khi kết thúc năm Thánh, Đức Pio XI đã ban hành Thông điệp Quas Primas, cho thêm ngày lễ "Chúa Giêsu Kitô Vua của chúng ta" vào Lịch Phụng vụ của Giáo hội. Đến năm 1969, Đức Giáo Hoàng Phaolô VI đã thực hiện một số bước nhằm nâng cao chứng tá của ngày lễ. Đồng thời, nhằm làm nổi bật hơn nữa sự liên kết giữa Vương quyền của Chúa Kitô với cuộc giáng lâm lần thứ hai của Người để xét xử thế giới, Đức Phaolô VI đã dời ngày lễ Chúa Giêsu Kitô Vua vào Chúa nhật cuối cùng của năm Phụng vụ, và nâng lên thành bậc lễ Trọng.


