Keep Christmas Out of Advent!

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:

Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

For many years, there has been a popular sentiment among Christians to “Keep Christ in Christmas.” This is a response to secularization and commercial dominance of the holidays and the need to keep focus on what makes Christmas what it is. However, at this time of year as Advent begins, I find it important as Catholics to make a parallel appeal: Keep Christmas Out of Advent! Now let me be clear up front: this is not literal—there is something of Christmas, the mystery of the Incarnation in all that we do as Catholics. And if Christ’s Mass is the origin of Christmas, we obviously don’t want to keep that out of anything!

But what I mean is that we are greatly impoverished in the United States by the premature celebration of Christmas. It is bad enough that from Thanksgiving on we are bombarded with Christmas music, shopping specials, Made for TV Christmas movies (because finding a boyfriend at Christmas is what it is all about - right ladies?) and themes, but now you are lucky if you are not hit with that before Halloween! And while some might make the argument that even the secular holiday culture contains seeds of goodness within it (which is true), the problem is that most people are completely burned out on Christmas by December 25/26. At the time when Christmas joy is supposed to be just beginning, most are ready to be done with it. And THAT is a travesty. We end up burning out on the substitute and missing the real gift.

The fact is that we NEED Advent to understand Christmas., just as we need Lent to prepare for Easter. To jump straight into the party without understanding the source of joy is to indulge in something fun but shallow. But if we allow ourselves to truly meditate on the cry of the human heart for God’s intervention and to anticipate deliverance and the dawning of salvation, our grasp of what truly makes Christmas joy will be much more profound.

I honestly enjoy Christmas much more when celebrated in other countries because it is quiet and muted leading up to Christmas Eve but then explodes into day after day of joy following. In the United States, we cannot complete escape the ambience of December, nor is it necessary that we do so. It is ok to participate in “Christmas” parties and gatherings (even if they are in Advent) to decorate and the like, but please, PLEASE show some restraint. Spend less time listening to Christmas music and more time in prayer so that there is something ready to joyfully burst forth when Christmas arrives. Trust me, you will be glad you did!





PARISH LIFE



Adviento 2023: ¿qué es y en qué consiste?



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
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
