RECTOR'S CORNER

September 22, 2024
Listen to Him

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:
Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

“LISTEN TO HIM.”

Chapter 9 of the Gospel of Mark begins with Peter, James, and John witnessing the awe-inspiring spectacle of the Transfiguration of Jesus. Terrified and not knowing what to say, Peter nonetheless attempts to say many words until the voice of the Father silences him: “This is my beloved Son. Listen to him.” (9:7)

At the Transfiguration, the chief disciples are given a glimpse of the divine glory of Jesus to steel them against the looming scandal of the Cross. From this point on Jesus begins to speak of how the Messiah must suffer and die. But the disciples, in their own ways of thinking and expectations, simply do not get it. Even as Jesus speaks of suffering and death, they are walking to Jerusalem with expectations of glory, privilege, and esteem.

In today’s Gospel (still in Chapter 9), one should notice that Jesus is not speaking in parables or veiled speech. He says “The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death he will rise.” (9:31). But they don’t understand, so they say nothing. Then they go back to arguing among themselves about who the greatest is. This sets the scene for the teaching of Jesus in today’s Gospel in which he says, “if anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all.” (9:35).

The disciples are so locked into their own ways of thinking that even when Jesus speaks bluntly to them, they do not understand and cling to their own way of thinking. Unfortunately, we tend to be just as guilty as the apostles were then. It is easy for us to read the scriptures and wonder how they failed to grasp what Jesus was telling them. How oblivious they were!

As we see in the writings of the New Testament, in the light of the resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit, they recognize how dull-witted they were and don’t hide from it. Renewed in humility, they seek to help shake others from the prisons of pride and worldly thinking.

Do we do the same? Do we hear the challenging truth that Jesus preaches to us? Or, like the disciples, do we just like the idea of “hanging out” in the company of Jesus while stubbornly refusing to be changed by his Word and by His sacrifice?

*O Sacred Heart of Jesus, we place all
our trust in you! Amen!*

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Contexto de la lectura del Evangelio

En el Evangelio de hoy, volvemos a oír a Jesús predecir a sus discípulos su pasión, muerte y resurrección. El contexto es importante. Jesús y sus discípulos se disponen a viajar por Galilea, territorio judío en el que Jesús ya ha tenido problemas con los fariseos. Quizá por eso Marcos indica que Jesús intentaba viajar en secreto. Al predecir su pasión, Jesús está reconociendo el peligro al que se enfrentarán e intenta preparar a sus discípulos para ello. Sin embargo, Marcos nos dice que los discípulos no entendían lo que Jesús decía y tenían miedo de preguntarle qué quería decir.

Tal vacilación por parte de los discípulos no es un comportamiento característico. Pedro no tuvo miedo de reprender a Jesús en el Evangelio de la semana pasada. Tal vez esto indique que los discípulos eran conscientes de que se estaba produciendo una nueva situación.

Marcos pinta un cuadro vívido en el Evangelio de hoy. Llegados a Cafarnaún, Jesús y sus discípulos entran en una casa. En este lugar privado, Jesús pregunta a sus discípulos sobre la discusión que tuvieron mientras viajaban. Una vez más, los discípulos guardan un silencio poco habitual y temen responder. Les han descubierto.

Jesús convoca entonces a los Doce, a quienes Marcos identificó anteriormente en su Evangelio como los elegidos por Jesús para predicar y expulsar demonios. A este selecto grupo de discípulos, Jesús les enseña que los que quieran ser los primeros en el reino de Dios deben ser servidores de todos.

Jesús llama a un niño y enseña a los Doce que recibir a un niño en nombre de Jesús es recibir a Jesús y a Aquel que lo envió. Es fácil que no comprendamos el significado de esta acción. En la Palestina del siglo I, los niños carecían de estatus o poder, no tenían derechos legales. Con esta acción, Jesús enseña a sus discípulos y a nosotros que, cuando servimos a los más pequeños, servimos a Jesús mismo. ¿Quiénes son las personas sin poder o estatus en nuestra sociedad a las que Jesús nos llama a servir? ¿Lo hacemos de buena gana? Jesús nos enseña que el juicio de Dios sobre nosotros se basará únicamente en este criterio.

5 claves para que tus hijos amen a la Iglesia

1. Fomenta el amor a la Iglesia

Es preciso que nuestros hijos vivan en un ambiente de respeto y amor por las cosas de Dios y la Iglesia, así sabrán darle su lugar en el corazón y en la vida cotidiana. Para lograrlo, es importante que ellos vean que amamos a la Iglesia y que no nos da pena.

2. Mientras más pronto, mejor

Es mejor comenzar a llevarlos desde pequeños a la Iglesia y que participen de las actividades parroquiales según su edad. Al principio, es difícil que quieran asistir voluntariamente, tengan la edad que tengan, por lo que habrá que encaminarlos. Poco a poco irán entrando en la dinámica y entonces será más fácil que asistan por gusto.

3. Empieza por lo pequeño

El que es fiel en lo poco, lo será en lo mucho. Por eso es bueno que empiecen con algún compromiso pequeño. Si nuestros hijos son chiquitos pueden asistir a la catequesis. Si ya son jóvenes, quizá sea mejor que comiencen por algún grupo juvenil apostólico para que tengan contacto con otros jóvenes.

4. Busca el lugar más adecuado

La parroquia es el lugar más recomendable para que los hijos vivan un ambiente de Iglesia; pero si no es posible, busca el lugar más adecuado para que convivan con otros jóvenes y hagan comunidad. La idea es que tengan espacios para que puedan crecer espiritualmente junto a otros jóvenes.

5. Apóyales en sus actividades

Muchas veces pasa que ya nuestros hijos están sumamente felices y trabajando en el grupo juvenil, y somos nosotros quienes les frenamos o les hacemos todo su proceso más difícil porque no comprendemos sus actividades o porque no les damos permiso para que asistan a ellas. Que un joven quiera participar en la vida activa de la Iglesia es una gracia y una enorme bendición. Por eso debemos dar gracias a Dios y orar para que esa disposición de nuestros hijos siga creciendo y de mucho fruto.

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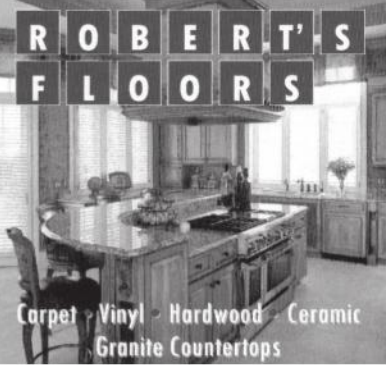
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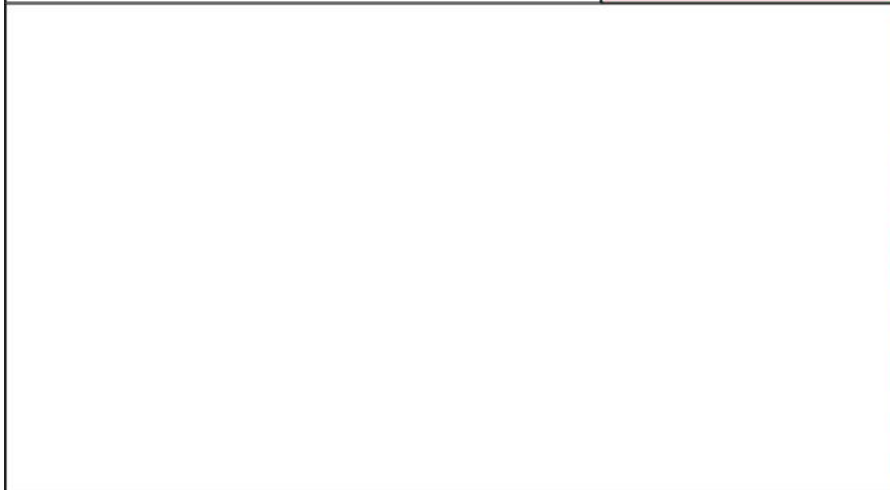
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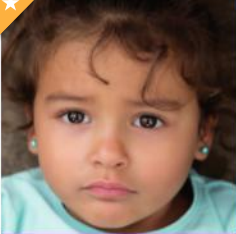
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
