RECTOR'S CORNER

Defend Us In Battle!

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:

Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

If today were not Sunday, we would be celebrating the liturgical Feast of the Archangels today. This is why the annual Blue Mass for Law Enforcement Officers is celebrated around this date (in this case today at the 11 AM Mass), due to the patronage of St. Michael the Archangel.

Someone once asked me if it was “unchristian” to pray in the St. Michael Prayer that Satan and the fallen angels be cast into hell. I had to explain the difference between praying for the seemingly worst of people who are nonetheless still capable of changing their hearts and praying for fallen angels who are incapable of changing—their lot is cast against God and against us for eternity! They are opposed by St. Michael, whose very name means “Who is like God?” Indeed! It is the question that condemns the fallen angels, who chose to reject God out of a desire to be gods until themselves. We are tempted to the same sin of pride constantly.

Police officers are subject to the same temptation as the rest of us as flawed human beings. They are tasked with serving the common good by enforcing our nation and community’s laws. They are asked to put themselves in harm’s way at times to serve and protect others. Much power is given them—power that can serve the good or, if corrupted, be used to serve themselves and violate public trust. This is why St. Michael is a powerful patron for law enforcement officers—the warrior in battle is a power image, intercessor, and protector. But St. Michael in his very name and humility also challenges the officer (and all of us) to remember that we are not God, but are instead called to serve.

We know that in our sociopolitical climate, law enforcement is an area of controversy. Offenses and mistakes by officers, large and small, are subject to great scrutiny, while we ignore the thankless service provided by so many. In some cases, we unfairly condemn officers for the same sins and lapses in judgment of which we are equally guilty. Like them, we are ALL called by God to do better: “what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?” (Micah 6:8).

Today we THANK our law enforcement officers for putting themselves in harm’s way to serve and protect all of us. Instead of tearing them down, may we pray through the intercession of St. Michael that they may be just, kind, humble, and be brought home safely in body and soul at the end of their watch.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, we place all our trust in you! Amen!





12 PROMISES OF THE SACRED HEART


Our Lord Jesus Christ appeared to St. Margaret Mary between 1673-1675. Among the words spoken to her, she heard Jesus make 12 promises to those who would respond to the pleading of His Heart and make an effort to return His love.

1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
2. I will establish peace in their homes.
3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
6. Sinners will find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
9. I will bless every place in which an image of My Heart is exposed and honored.
10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart.
12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in My disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

Octubre: Mes dedicado al Santo Rosario

El rosario es una devoción mariana que surgió en la Edad Media cuando los cristianos saludaban a María con el título de rosa. En esa época se les permitía a los que no podían cantar los 150 Salmos del Oficio Divino recitar 150 avemarias. Las avemarias significaban dar rosas a María, de ahí surge el rosario a María.

El avemaría es una oración que encontramos en el evangelio de Lucas: "Dios te salve, llena de gracia", es el saludo del ángel Gabriel anunciando a María que va a ser la madre de nuestro Señor. Este saludo del ángel se convirtió en la primera línea del avemaría, oración a María que nos recuerda que ella nos lleva a Jesús. Durante el rezo del rosario rezamos avemarias y meditamos sobre eventos importantes de la vida de María y Jesús.

El Santo Rosario otorga un infinito poder que solamente se obtiene con la fe y devoción a nuestra Madre Santísima, el cual concede los siguientes beneficios para el alma:

- **Unidad con nuestra Madre celestial:** Además de rezar para María, rezamos junto con ella y la invitamos a que rece por nosotros. La oración se hace mas fuerte porque la Virgen siempre recibe lo que ella pide.
- **Arma contra el maligno:** Es un arma poderosa que nos trae la verdadera paz. La Virgen nos invita a rezar el Santo Rosario en cada una de sus apariciones.
- **Aporta virtudes:** Que tal vez desconocíamos de uno mismo.
- **Llena de humildad:** Nos invita a seguir el ejemplo de humildad como María
- **Concede indulgencias:** Disminuye alguna parte de los castigos que tendríamos que sufrir por nuestros pecados, en el purgatorio.
- **La oración perfecta:** En cada decena de las avemarias se medita el sufrimiento, la lucha y el triunfo de Jesús, donde la Virgen estuvo presente para ayudarle a cumplir su misión salvadora.
- **Conversión de los herejes:** Innumerables testimonios de conversión han surgido por el mundo, de quienes no creían en Dios y gracias al rezo del Santo Rosario han vuelto a la Iglesia Católica.
- **Sana el corazón:** Borra la tristeza del alma y llena de alegría y amor el corazón.
- **Aceptación de la Voluntad Divina:** Hace comprender, sin cuestionar, las situaciones que nos cuestan aceptar.


