RECTOR'S CORNER

October 6, 2024
Our Lady of Victory

Dear Friends in Christ:

Anh chị em thân mến trong Chúa Kitô:
Estimados Amigos y Amigas en Cristo:

At the time you are reading this letter this weekend, I am with our pilgrim group in Greece, following in the footsteps of St. Paul. On Sunday, we will be in Delphi before making our way to Mykonos on Monday.

What is fascinating to me is that without any intentionality on our part, we will celebrate Monday's liturgical Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary very close to the site that is its inspiration. In fact, we are in Delphi on Sunday, which is the closest city to the place of the Battle of Lepanto in the Gulf of Patras.

In this pivotal battle, the underdog naval forces of the Holy League (a coalition forged by Pope Pius V) met the threatening fleet of the Ottoman Turks—a threat that was one of religious conquest as much as military conquest. In history's last major naval battle fought between rowing vessels (over 450 ships, mostly galleys and their complements of infantry), the Holy League emerged victorious and dealt the Ottoman Empire a staggering defeat that for the most part ended their era of military expansion, even though land battles in Europe would continue for another century.

Beyond Lepanto's significance in military history, however, is its place on our liturgical calendar. Given the grave danger Europe faced, Pope Pius V asked Christians to pray the rosary imploring the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the battle to come. Following the triumphant outcome, he inscribed the Feast of Our Lady of Victory on the liturgical calendar on October 7, the day on which the battle had been won by the Christian forces.

The modern calendar has renamed the feast day Our Lady of the Rosary to tone down the militaristic tones, but the message remains the same—prayer works! In ages past, our forbears would often join together in prayer for great societal needs, a lesson sometimes forgotten in our more “enlightened” age. We pray as parish communities and certainly as individuals, but when we unite in prayer seeking God's aid, his deliverance is not to be underestimated!

Therefore, as we celebrate this 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time and tomorrow's Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, may we unite in prayer that the Church and our nation may be delivered from all evil from inside and out. Our Lady of Victory, pray for us!


PARISH LIFE

La historia de la Batalla de Lepanto, donde el cristianismo obtuvo la victoria al encornerarse a la Virgen María, nos deja tres principales enseñanzas:

- **El poder de la oración como arma espiritual:** La victoria en Lepanto es un recordatorio del impacto que tiene la oración en la vida de los creyentes. A pesar de que la flota cristiana era superada en número por el Imperio Otomano, la intercesión de la Virgen, solicitada a través del rezo del R, demostró que la fe puede cambiar el curso de los acontecimientos.
- **La unidad en la fe para enfrentar grandes desafíos:** La devoción a la Virgen del Rosario unió a los creyentes de toda Europa en un momento crucial de la historia. La batalla no sólo fue una lucha militar, sino también una manifestación de unidad cristiana bajo la protección de la Virgen María. Nos enseña que, ante los grandes desafíos, la comunidad de fe debe permanecer unida, confiando en la guía divina para enfrentar las pruebas y superar obstáculos aparentemente imposibles.
- **La intercesión de María como madre protectora:** La victoria en Lepanto reforzó la creencia en el papel de la Virgen María como intercesora ante Dios y protectora de los fieles. Esta enseñanza nos recuerda que la Virgen María es una madre que cuida y protege a aquellos que acuden a ella. La Batalla de Lepanto nos muestra que, al poner nuestra confianza en María, ella intercede ante su Hijo y nos ayuda a superar las batallas de la vida, tanto espirituales como materiales.





Khi các giám mục và giáo dân gặp nhau trong phần thứ hai của Thượng Hội đồng về Hiệp hành trong tháng Mười, các tín hữu được yêu cầu cầu nguyện để “Giáo hội tiếp tục duy trì lối sống hiệp hành về mọi mặt”.
