



A Kingdom of Sacrifice and Service

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

The First Reading we heard today from the prophet Isaiah was prophesied six hundred years before the birth of Christ. It was one of various prophecies about how the Messiah would save God's people: Through suffering. In other words, God was preparing his chosen people to recognize the promised Messiah by "affliction" and by "being crushed in iniquity." The Messiah is to be known as the suffering servant. These are direct allusions to the passion, crucifixion, and death of our Lord Jesus Christ – six hundred years ahead of time. And it was precisely through those sufferings that Jesus would take all our sins upon himself, atone for them, and re-open the gates of heaven for us.

We can tell from today's Gospel that the apostles were oblivious of the prophecy from Isaiah. Their idea of the Messiah was a powerful political and military leader who would bring Israel back as a player on the international scene. And so, James and John, looking forward to that day, try to reserve their spots in the King's cabinet. Jesus took the occasion to teach them that his Kingdom is about sacrifice and service, not power politics and self-indulgence. Whatever authority is to be exercised by the disciples must, like that of Jesus, be rendered as service to others rather than for personal aggrandizement.

Being a servant does not mean allowing people to walk all over us. Sometimes it calls for us to be firm and stand up for ourselves. A parent who always lets their child have his or her own way would be doing a disservice to their child. A police officer who did not stop traffic violators wouldn't be serving anyone. A teacher who lets a student get by with cheating or not doing their work would be a poor servant as well as a poor teacher. Being a servant is not about popularity. Jesus knew that his service of healing the sick, casting out demons, and teaching would change lives but at the same time be misunderstood, ignored, and hated, yet he was ready to lay down his life in order to serve others, proving once and for all that nothing we can do, no matter how terrible it may be, will turn away his love.


