

#### Parish Priest's Corner

#### The Temptation of Jesus

My dear friends in Christ,

Today's gospel reading presents us with the temptation of Jesus. Notice that the Gospel began by telling us that Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert. In other words, Jesus was not alone in the desert. Naturally speaking, you would think that the devil seeing Jesus and the Holy Spirit would retreat, but he was determined to derail Jesus from his mission of transforming lives and saving souls. Jesus' temptation ended in victory and became the beginning of the reconstruction and reunification of the world because despite the inducement to satisfy the self, he remained selfless.

On Ash Wednesday, we heard about the three pillars of Lent namely, *prayer*, *fasting and almsgiving*, and we were encouraged to go into the desert of our hearts for forty day, and strive to embrace these pillars of our faith. It is appropriate that we are reminded today that faith in God and our efforts to pray, fast, and give alms do not exempt us from or make us less vulnerable to temptation; rather, when we do not get discouraged in the face of tribulations, we become stronger and grow deeper in our faith.

Just like Jesus our Savior, we will face different kinds of temptation. Part of our temptation may be that we gave up something for Lent and try to reward ourselves in some other way; it may be that we constantly seek attention or approval for works of charity; it may even be that after a few days into Lent, forty days begin to appear too long and we begin to slip away from upholding what we gave up for Lent. Whatever the case, I encourage you to persevere and journey with Christ till the end.

With Jesus we pray "Our Father...lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil," Amen.

You are an apostle who can make a difference! Sign up!



### **Catechetical Nugget**

#### The Second Half of the Mass: the Liturgy of the Eucharist

At the Last Supper, on the night when He was betrayed, our Savior instituted the Eucharistic sacrifice of His Body and Blood. He did this in order to perpetuate the sacrifice of the Cross throughout the centuries until He should come again, and so to entrust to His beloved spouse, the Church, a memorial of His death and resurrection: a sacrament of love, a sign of unity, a bond of charity, a paschal banquet in which Christ is eaten, the mind is filled with grace, and a pledge of future glory is given to us.

We remember the words spoken by Jesus at the Last Supper. At the end of the meal he took bread, blessed it, broke it, and said, "Take this all of you and eat it, for this is my body which will be given up for you." He took the cup filled with wine and said, "Take this all of you and drink from it, for this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant which will be given up for you. Do this in memory of me"

From the first Masses of the Apostles in the Upper Room of Jerusalem, this is the way the Eucharist has been celebrated. Jesus blessed the bread, and so the Priest gives thanks for the gift of salvation in the great Eucharistic Prayer, and the gifts of bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. Just as Jesus broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, the Priest breaks the bread which has become Christ's Body so that we, though many, may receive from the one bread the Lord's Body and from the one chalice the Lord's Blood in the same way the Apostles received them from Christ's own hands.

#### **Total Immersion**

It was during this time 8 years ago, that our daughter lived in Paris, France for a semester abroad during her college years. It was her first time travelling alone to a foreign country. There she was totally immersed in Parisian life. She had to speak French, her college classes were taught and spoken in French, textbooks were all written in French and she had to write only in French. The end result? A semester she will never forget; one full of new challenges she overcame; one full of adventure and friendships made that continue on – a tremendous blessing.

There is something significant that happens when one decides with certainty, to embark on a particular course. I know it did for me during Lent last year as I was grieving the loss of our youngest son. I felt a deep need to draw nearer to Christ, and Lent became that time of greater intimacy and grace.

The Church invites us throughout the 40 days of Lent, to deeper prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Along those lines, our own parish offers other spiritual activities; our Lenten retreat, Lenten faith-sharing groups and Stations of the Cross. I know from experience that Lent can be a very special time of spiritual renewal.

Consider total immersion in all that the Church offers to us during this season of Lent. Jump in! Expect the unexpected as you journey with Christ on His Way to the Cross. You will be blessed.
