

Pastor's Corner

Does the Mass Transform You?

1st Reading: 1 Kgs 19:4-8 | 2nd Reading: Eph 4:30-5:2 | Gospel: Jn 6:41-51

GROW: We have apps that monitor our sleep and calories, and remind us to get our steps in. Short on time? We order takeout or subscribe to a meal service. Yet, despite these modern conveniences, I would guess that most of us don't sleep enough or consistently eat well. And we pay the price, whether in the short or long term. Enter Elijah, who had reached his limit physically and mentally. Yet after an angel provided him food and drink, Elijah found the strength to walk 40 days and 40 nights. Impressive! But that's God for us! And in the provision of his Son, we have food and drink – bread from heaven – that not only sustains us for our journey on earth but offers the possibility of eternal life. This is our belief; this is what Jesus says to us. And that alone can give us strength, and hope, even when we're having an "Elijah" moment. For at each and every holy Mass, Jesus invites us to the table, offering us food that not only sustains but also transforms us. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord, indeed!

GO: Just as a good night's sleep and proper nutrition help us function our best, the Word of God and the Eucharist, and our communal life of faith, provide the spiritual nourishment we need as we strive to be imitators of God in our daily lives, as Saint Paul says. As we partake of Christ in the Eucharist, say a prayer of thanksgiving and ask Jesus to help us grow in the ways of love that Paul outlined: kindness, compassion, and forgiveness toward the people we encounter. It could mean letting go of a grudge, becoming more conscious of the needs of others, listening respectfully to someone with whom we disagree, or perhaps forgiving ourselves. The Holy Spirit will guide us.

REFLECT: Think about the ways the Mass transforms you. It may be something subtle – the spirit of consolation and the feeling that things are right in your world – or you may have been particularly moved by the readings, homily, music, or silent prayer. Tell someone about it!

Parish Health & Safety Guidelines - Sunday Obligation Update

- All indoor liturgical celebrations will return to normal practice - without capacity limitations, social distancing, sign-up systems, or segregation between those vaccinated and those unvaccinated. Masks may be worn but are not required.
- All previous liturgical restrictions are lifted, except for the following:
 - The Precious Blood will not be offered to the faithful.
 - The Sign of Peace will not be exchanged through physical contact.
- Cleaning after Masses will continue to take place.
- Coffee and donuts will resume as soon as it can be coordinated.

Effective Friday, July 16, 2021, Archbishop Sample rescinds the dispensation from the obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation. Canon Law still allows those who are vulnerable, sick, or who have other grave reasons, to miss Holy Mass if necessary. Those unable to attend the Sunday Eucharist for such reasons are asked to honor the Lord in another way that day by watching a livestreamed Mass, praying the rosary, reading sacred Scripture, or otherwise setting aside time to be with the Lord.

Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross ~ Feast Day August 9

A brilliant philosopher who stopped believing in God when she was 14, Edith Stein was so captivated by reading the autobiography of Teresa of Avila that she began a spiritual journey that led to her baptism in 1922. Twelve years later she imitated Saint Teresa by becoming a Carmelite, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

Born into a prominent Jewish family in Breslau, Germany - now Wroclaw, Poland - Edith abandoned Judaism in her teens. As a student at the University of Göttingen, she became fascinated by phenomenology and earned a doctorate in philosophy in 1916. She continued as a university teacher until 1922, when she moved to a Dominican school in Speyer. Her appointment as lecturer at the Educational Institute of Munich ended under pressure from the Nazis. After living for four years in the Cologne Carmel, Sister Teresa Benedicta moved to the Carmelite monastery in Echt, Netherlands, in 1938. The Nazis occupied that country in 1940. In retaliation for being denounced by the Dutch bishops, the Nazis arrested all Dutch Jews who had become Christians.

Teresa Benedicta and her sister Rosa, also a Catholic, died in a gas chamber in Auschwitz on August 9, 1942. Pope John Paul II beatified Teresa Benedicta of the Cross in 1987 and canonized her 12 years later.



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On June 7, I received the official news that I have been appointed from Administrator to Pastor of Holy Trinity Parish in Bandon and St. John's Mission in Port Orford. This is a joyful news for our faith community. I am humbled and honored to serve God and his people in this capacity. The care of souls is an enormous task and a fragile responsibility, which depends on the unceasing grace of God for "without him we can do nothing." And so, my dear friends, I ask you to please pray for me, that I may be faithful to this calling. The easiest way the devil tries to disintegrate the people of God is to attack their priest. I ask you to please pray one Hail Mary for me every day that Our Blessed Mother Mary may cover me with her maternal mantle. Let's hold each other up in prayer unceasingly.

When a pastor is appointed for a parish, he is publicly installed by a liturgical rite. The installation usually takes place in a Sunday Mass and involves the pastor making the Profession of Faith and taking Oath of Office. The Archbishop is the usual celebrant of this rite. However, he may delegate a priest to preside in his place. For my installation, Archbishop Sample has delegated Fr. Todd Molinari, Vicar for Clergy, to preside over the ceremony. During the ceremony, an attestation of the installation of the Pastor is signed by Vicar for Clergy, the Pastor, and chairs of Pastoral and Finance Councils. This document is sent to the Archbishop, which in turn is sent to the Vatican.
