

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear friends in Christ,

Praying for Eucharistic Revival

The Church in the United States has recently embarked on a journey to revive the centrality of the Eucharist in our land. As part of the Eucharistic revival called for by the U.S. Bishops, Archbishop Alexander Sample, Bishop Liam Cary of Baker Diocese and the Oregon Knights of Columbus are inviting all Catholic churches in Oregon to hold a Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration on or around January 29, 2022.

To join in this spiritual exercise with our Catholic brothers and sisters throughout the country, Holy Trinity and St. John's will devote Adoration hours on Thursday, January 27, and Friday, January 28. Eucharistic Adoration takes place at Holy Trinity Chapel from 12:30 – 8:00pm on Thursday and 9:30 am – Noon of Friday. I invite all parishioners to come at any hour that works with your schedule and pray before the Blessed Sacrament for Eucharist revival in our land. The Eucharist is the joy of our life and the foundation of our faith as Catholics. We cannot afford to lose its relevance. Come and Pray!

Synod on Synodality

Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about what is happening in local parishes. He and the bishops and priests would like to know what individuals think we should all be doing to help make our parishes better. The way he has proposed doing this is a synodal process. Synod means "journeying together" and it involves listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other in order to discern the path we are called to walk together.

The synod "is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission."

The practice of living as a synodal Church means:

- The conversations lead to conversion to Christ and commitment to active participation in the mission given by Christ — Communion
- The people of God talk with one another and listen to one another about questions that matter — Participation
- The communion exists for a common purpose; mission flows naturally from the experience of communion — Mission.

In the month of February, the Pastoral Councils of both Holy Trinity and St. John's will present a framework on how our parish will participate in this synodal process. Let us pray with and for each other as we embark on this journey together.

Prayer for Synod on Synodality

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it.

We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder.

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Let us find in You our unity so that we may journey together to eternal life

and not stray from the way of truth and what is right.

All this we ask of You, who are at work in every place and time,

in the communion of the Father and the Son, forever and ever. **Amen.**

The Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle / Feast Day January 25th



The story of Paul's conversion on the road to Damascus is told in Acts 9:1-19 and retold by Paul in Acts 22:6-21 and Acts 26:12-18.

Saul of Tarsus, a Pharisee in Jerusalem after the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ, swore to wipe out the new Christian church, called The Way.

Acts 9:1 says that Paul was "breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples." Saul obtained letters from the high priest, authorizing him to arrest any followers of Jesus in the city of Damascus.

On the Road to Damascus, Saul and his companions were struck down by a blinding light. Saul heard a voice say, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" (Acts 9:4, NIV)

When Saul asked who was speaking, the voice replied: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." (Acts 9:5-6, NIV)

Saul was blinded. His companions led him into Damascus to a man named Judas, on Straight Street. For three days Saul was blind and didn't eat or drink.

Meanwhile, Jesus appeared in a vision to a disciple in Damascus named Ananias and told him to go to Saul. Ananias was afraid because he knew Saul's reputation as a merciless persecutor of the church. Jesus

repeated his command, explaining that Saul was his chosen instrument to deliver the gospel to the Gentiles, their kings, and the people of Israel. So Ananias found Saul at Judas' house, praying for help. Ananias laid his hands on Saul, telling him Jesus had sent him to restore his sight and that Saul might be filled with the Holy Spirit.

Something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He arose and was baptized into the Christian faith. Saul ate, regained his strength, and stayed with the Damascus disciples three days.

After his conversion, Saul changed his name to Paul.


