When I attended here in the early 60's there were 1,000 students taught by the Notre Dame Sisters. They would have 50 students in a classroom. Of course, if Sr. Mary Walburges was your teacher, you did not move a muscle! Now, we are down to 150 in the whole school! Thanks to our participation in EdChoice for tuition assistance, we have been able to keep the school doors open.

It is my hope that we will be able to continue our long tradition. The school is a blessing not only for our parish family but also for our local community. Many of the children attending now are not of our faith tradition, but join us as we talk about and pray to God in our classrooms. The Catholic school is a critical way of handing on our faith and spreading the good news of the Gospel to the next generation.

Thanks to our principal and staff, we can be proud of our grade school. In a special way, I want to thank Sharon (Urig) Waschek, our principal, for the incredible work she does in providing opportunities for the education of our children. The teachers are truly dedicated and care about their students. They sacrifice a lot to teach here at St. Mary School. It is truly a ministry. I want to also recognize Mary Poling, our school secretary and the support staff for their patience and hard work.

As we begin enrollment for the '24-'25 school year, I encourage you to consider sending your child(ren) here to St. Mary's. Thanks to state funding from EdChoice and the money made possible through your support of the diocesan Angel Scholarship Fund, the parents of our children in K-8 pay minimal tuition! I want to thank all who filed with the Angel Scholarship Fund to direct their Ohio tax money to our school. We received over \$20,000 from those who filed the paperwork with the diocese this past year. You can direct the tax money you pay to the State of Ohio specifically to St. Mary School. May more of our children take advantage of the 'affordable' Catholic education available to them here at St. Mary's school.




