## the Quill and the Cloth

**“So she said to her husband, ‘I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there.’ Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight.”**

**- First Reading (Second Book of Kings)**

I know of a good number of priests who have what I refer to as a “Holiday House”. The priests who have these homes will tell you that these are their “Day-Off Homes”. The priests who have these homes away from the rectory hold that they can only truly “relax” and “rest” when they are away from the rectory. To date, I do not possess such a residence as Tuesdays tend to be catch-up days in the rectory, or days that I will run errands, or visit with my parents.



For the most part, I find the rectories I have lived in (*where there are no parish offices*) especially Holy Rosary’s, as a place that I can truly rest and relax; although most days there is usually a soul or two who comes to the door (*especially on Tuesdays*) needing a door unlocked, making a delivery, or looking for a handout. For me, my residence is also a private place away from the public for prayer, rest and study. In fact, I am writing in my home office in the “rectory” these comments right now, as it is usually a much quieter place to perform composition than the office in the school. For while I am pleased pastorally with all of the activities in our school building, as we are utilizing well this large facility, even though we no longer have a Catholic School, the building is often like Grand Central Station with religious education and the staff meeting and working with people. It is also a place where our many renters have many active clients coming and going from karate to carrying a tune on the piano or violin.

I mention these things because we all need a place to be spiritually renewed. For some of you it is the lake cabin. For others, rest and renewal may be taking some time off and going on a summer vacation. Rest and renewal might be the garage on a warm summer night or a hobby/sewing room where we can shut out the world. Wherever our place of refuge is, it is also an important place to develop our religious beliefs and our relationship with God. We need a place “to be”; to be with our FAMILY, to be where there is FUN, to be where we can develop our FAITH; and sometimes JUST A PLACE TO BE!


In today’s first reading from the Book of Kings, the great prophet Elisha encounters a couple who shows him great hospitality by offering him a special room (kind of a Holiday House) to rest, relax, and practice the religion of a prophet. The Good News is not only the hospitality the couple extends, but

also the holiness they perceive through the prophet. **The Good News is also that the prophet Elisha recognizes the religious need for refuge spiritually and takes up the couple’s offer and stays in this special room that was made for him.** This story reminds me of a couple I personally have known for many years, who, when they built their new home, they included a bedroom and bath above the garage that they always maintained was built for me to get away from the parish. I actually made use of that space on a number of occasions and I always returned to the parish more rested and renewed.

But just as all work and no play is a bad thing; so too, all play and no work is equally a bad thing. Sometimes our hobbies can become our life, and this is not a good thing. In the case of the priesthood, I have known many a clergyman that their Holiday House becomes more important than the House of God. Of course the people notice these things and sometimes priests get less than flattering nick-names from the faithful, like “Father-Gone-Again”. **The Gospel reminds us that the FIRST and FOREMOST thing in our life should not be RELAXING, RELATIVES or any form of RECREATION; but instead should be the REDEEMER.** For Jesus says in St. Matthew’s gospel: **“Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me.”** All of the good things in life can NEVER be prioritized above the goodness of God and giving Him the praise and worship that He is due!

So what is the TOP PRIORITY of your life? For this Dutchman, one of my “top priorities” is having things clean in the house, office, sacristy and sanctuary. This past Tuesday, I spent all day “spring-house-cleaning” which (I know this is going to sound strange) I find very “relaxing”; even if my back does not always feel that way. (*I tracked yesterday that I went up and down the stairs 34 times!*) When I bleed, red blood does not come out, but instead bleach. Yet, as the picture above shows, I changed the filter “again” on Tuesday, and in spite of closed windows, and constant cleaning, look at how the filter for the air looks when compared to a new one! It has felt like a war with dust and dirt on three fronts this summer. The dust was coming from down-under through the rectory basement with the sewer work. (Thank God that is done!) The dust has been coming from the east with the house move on the east side of the rectory. (Hopefully it will be gone soon!) There has been lots of dust from the west as they continue to work on the church’s exterior! I am looking forward to washing windows in a week or two when the construction comes to a close!

Yet, even I need to continue to learn and grow as a “reverend”, that even more important than “removing dirt and dust” (which is a godly thing) is “religion” and the “Redeemer”, and one day that “reward” of everlasting life. Even though it is summer, always plan to prioritize daily prayer and the supreme prayer of the Mass each weekend wherever you find yourselves! Happy Summer!

## Holy Rosary Repair Report

**Former Hunt House:** Another week and we have taken another step or two forward (literally) on our infrastructure improvements. The former Hunt House has literally moved a few steps to the west this week and is now ready to be moved onto the street. The garage was also moved ahead off of its foundation and, God-willing, they will be off the property sometime soon. We are now finalizing the contractor to remove the debris, disconnect the utilities, and put gravel down. My pastoral goal is to have it all completed by August 1st! Hope springs eternal!



**Rectory Sewer Repairs:** Praise God! This will be the last time that I will have to report on this project. The project to unearth the sewer, remove a section, repair the main line, replace the cast iron piping with plastic, reconnect everything and cement the basement floor was a 4 day process. They also solved the potential problem of sewage coming back into the house in the future, for which I am grateful. It was also discovered that the removal of the lead pipes would be cost prohibitive at this time as it would be necessary to tear up part of our street. When the street is repaired in the coming years, I plan to have all those pipes replaced with copper at that time. As good as a job that they did, I was glad to see the plumbers go on Monday evening. The men and women who did the work on the project were both pleasant and professional and the project is under warranty for 10 years. I notice in both the bathroom and the kitchen how well the drains are now working. This project was long over-due. Thank you to those that donated towards this project that was so practical and necessary. The next project is to clean the basement and do some much needed painting.



**Church Exterior Repair:** I was told by the foreman that the project would be done by the close of this week. I am quite confident that they will "not" be done by this Friday. I am only guessing, but I suspect that "maybe" the work will be done by Friday, July 7th. But with the 4th of July holiday in there as well, I have my doubts. The rain has also slowed some of the work on this project. The work that they are doing is superior. I have no doubt that the work was most necessary. It was also discovered this week that part of one of our flat roofs, about 20 feet by 20 feet is leaking quite severely. I guess that we are going to address that at this time as well. There is no end to the repairs and maintenance. Although, when this work is done on the exterior of the church, we should be good for a few years, except for sealing the brick in about five years or so which is a relatively quick process. Thank you for your patience!

The cancer spread from her abdomen and is surrounding and pressing on her aorta so surgery is not an option. Four different kinds of chemo are being used in an attempt to shrink the cancer.
