Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

"Even the soldiers jeered at Him. As they approached to offer Him wine, they called out, "If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself." Above Him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews."

My Dad used to say to me (in words similar to these), when I came home from major seminary and spent endless hours upstairs working on papers and homework; "They are over-educating you. You are splitting theological hairs. They should teach you some common sense on how to

run things." As I sat upstairs at the table in a large bedroom from my brothers, my Mother would come upstairs and say: "We have nothing on you coming home if you spend all of your time studying. Then you could have stayed in the Twin Cities."

When I was younger I dreamed of teaching in the major seminary. It was only a passing dream as I knew I would never have a chance for further studies after my Master's Degree in Divinity. But if I had been given that chance, I would have told those future priests and leaders in the Church, that if you are going to be an effective pastor, then you have to be prepared to live a life of sacrifice and suffering and to do it with joy and without complaint. So much of the priesthood is listening to the souls that are entrusted to your care that are carrying some sort of cross due to the vocation of marriage, the birth of children, child rearing, raising teenagers, adult children living unvirtuous lives or have perhaps abandoned the faith, and old age with its many sorrows leading to death itself.

For those of you that were at my installation as pastor five-and-a-half years ago, Bishop LeVoir made mention in our very church, that one of the great sorrows of being a pastor is administration. For in pastoral administration you can expect to have the faithful come up to you after just celebrating Holy Mass, as you are still dressed in your vestments and saying: "Father, one of the toilets in the women's restroom is running over"; or "Father I don't agree with a particular project you are working on." As one of my farmer friends from a previous assignment advised me a number of years ago: "Father, just smile and say to them, 'I am sorry about that.' Or, 'I am sorry that you feel that way'."

This weekend we bring a close to the liturgical year with the celebration of the Feast of Christ the King. One might expect that the Gospel would be the passage of power from St. Matthew where the Lord is judging souls as a shepherd separates sheep from goats at the end of time. But instead, this liturgical cycle ends with the Christ and His life ending on the cross. A theological curiosity, don't you think? I think I might be able to explain the choice of this gospel to you from all those extra hours studying upstairs in that farmhouse during those holiday breaks.

Recall the words of St. Paul elsewhere in the New Testament when he says, "When I am weak, it is then that I am strong". As Christ hung on the cross, He was undoubtedly weak physically, but He was at the same time strong spiritually as the SUPREME SERVANT-LEADER was taking away the sins of the world through that one painful act on that first Good Friday. If we take on the role of the servant-leader, we also gain a spiritual strength and wisdom. As a priest, if you are doing your job, you are working in church getting things ready when no one is around. You spend hours each week (as I am doing right now on this Sunday evening, as the bulletin is due on Monday noon, Ugh...) writing bulletins and sermons for Sunday. As the pastor, you are usually the first to arrive before the liturgy, making sure everything is ready and you are almost always the last to leave as you need to get ready for the next Mass or to put everything away. But the Good News is that after a half-a-decade, I know these buildings. I know why a candle will not light. I know who practices the faith and who does not. I know who are attentive at Mass and those who find listening difficult. I know pretty much those who are reading these words I am writing and those who cannot or will not make time to read these words.

In whatever leadership role God the Father has called us to, from being crucified on a cross, to being a clergyman in a church, to being a married couple with all of the challenges of marriage and family life; as long as Christ is the King of our lives and hearts, all of the sufferings and sacrifices, both great and small, make sense. For St. Paul writes elsewhere in the scriptures that "our suffering makes up for what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ". And if Christ is truly King of our hearts and lives, then all of our sacrifices and sufferings pale in comparison to the sufferings of Christ.

Show me someone who is in any position of leadership great or small and I will show you someone that has been called to make sacrifices and to suffer. Show

me a person who has accepted those sorrows with joy, I will show you a person who is a believer in Christ. Show me someone who only grows desperate, despondent and depressed over their earthly leadership, and I will show you someone who does not believe that Jesus is the Christ, the King of their lives!

Hopefully the Feast of Christ the King is much more than a final feast at the close of the liturgical year. I hope and pray that this solemnity will send a spiritual message to our hearts to reaffirm that Christ is the King of our hearts and our lives in all that we do, both in joy and in sorrow; so that when we pass from this life, we might be counted as those saved sheep, at the right hand of God, singing his praises forever in the green pastures of everlasting life. Happy Thanksgiving! Be thankful at your dinner tables even for the sorrows and sufferings in our leadership roles; for then, in union with Christ also then share in a special intimacy with our King who carried the cross for the salvation of the world. God love you!

All families, especially those with children, are invited to attend an Advent Prayer Service with Bishop






Happy Thanksgiving to All!

Looking back over the bulletin from a year ago at this time, the parish had only paid around \$52,000.00 to Loyola. When compared to this year, we have almost tripled that amount, as we are at \$136,571.97, or an increase from last year by \$84,571.97. However, last year we were slightly further ahead in our contributions to the Diocese of New Ulm. For this year we have paid out \$15,533.00; while last year we had paid a slightly higher amount at \$23,156.22. The difference of these two figures comes to \$7,623.22. So, all in all, we are ahead of last year contributions by almost \$77,000.00. My pastoral goal is to see if we can have the Loyola stewardship commitment completed by the close of the 2019 calendar year. As in the past years, we will be taking up a collection at the Christmas Masses that brings in nearly \$2,000.00 for this stewardship goal. As always, thank you for your continued gifts of stewardship.







Statement from Bishop John M. LeVoir of the Diocese of New Ulm Regarding Filing of Plan of Reorganization

NEW ULM (November 14, 2019) - Today, we have taken another step in the legal process to fairly resolve sexual abuse claims made against the Diocese of New Ulm. We have filed a plan of reorganization and a disclosure statement with the U.S. Bankruptcy Court.

The plan of reorganization filed today details how the Diocese of New Ulm will meet its obligations in the \$34,000,000 settlement in our bankruptcy case. The settlement funds are made up of insurance coverage settlements and cash contributions from the diocese and parishes, including parishes that do not have claims against them. The disclosure statement provides summary information to be sent to claimants to help them determine whether they wish to approve the settlement.

The next steps are for the bankruptcy judge to review the disclosure statement and approve it if it provides adequate information. Then, the plan and disclosure statement will be sent to the claimants who will respond by sending in their ballots. When two-thirds of voting claimants approve the plan, the bankruptcy judge will hold a hearing to determine if all of the requirements of the bankruptcy law have been met. When they have been met, then the judge will issue an order confirming the plan. After confirmation of the plan, a trust will be created consisting of the assets described in the plan. A plan trustee, approved by the court, will then make payments to the claimants.

The Diocese of New Ulm filed for bankruptcy in March 2017. In June 2019, we reached a settlement with representatives of victims and survivors of clergy sexual abuse who have made claims against the diocese and parishes within the geographic area the diocese serves. The Diocese of New Ulm is committed to finding a fair resolution for victims and survivors of sexual abuse while continuing our ministry for those we serve throughout south and west central Minnesota.
