

Happy Easter! Over the past 12 months, we have all heard new words and phrases that have become household terms. Just a little over a year ago, few if any of us were using in our common conversations words or phrases such as, **“social distancing, pandemic, COVID-19, distance learning, zoom meetings,”** and many others that today have become so common. Perhaps the one phrase that has rubbed me the most religiously is the phrase, **“believing in science.”**

Personally, I believe that *believing in science* is kind of an oxymoron. I ask you, how hard is it to believe in something that you can experience with your own senses? There are many people out there in this country of ours that are refusing to take the vaccine. I have read that as many as one-third of medical personnel are refusing to take the COVID-19 vaccine. When we hear things like this, we might begin to ask ourselves: **“Do they know something scientifically that I don’t know?”**

The older we get, the more that clinics and medical procedures become part and parcel of the common soul. Back in 1736, one of our Founding Fathers, Benjamin Franklin, said wisely that, **“An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.”** Mr. Franklin was of course, referring to fires, and not necessarily keeping ourselves in fine health. Yet, this expression has often come to be associated with good health and less with preventing horrible fires in our urban areas.

One of my Lenten resolutions, and certainly a penance, was to catch up on my medical exams from

head to toe. One of these procedures of course involves being put under the sedative *propofol*. I suppose it is a *belief in science* that when you are put under for that half-hour or so, that you will wake up after the experience is over. Since I have had it done a half-dozen times or so, with no severe side-effects; I guess I have enough faith in science and the medical community that there is nothing to worry about in this regard.

This time, when I came to in the recovery room, lying on the gurney, with only a light medical garment and blanket around me, I woke up alone and laid there with gratitude that the ordeal was over, as well as having a little bit of a euphoric feeling. ***I thought to myself, I wonder if maybe this was what the Lord might have felt like on that first Easter. The Lord might have said to Himself, “Well, I am sure glad that that whole Good Friday thing is done. I had faith in the Father and it turned out all right. It is still early Easter morning and I am going to just lie here for just a few more minutes and savor this resurrection moment.”***

Just as medical staff come in and check up on you, all of the gospels record that Mary Magdalene comes to check on the body of the Lord. Just as the doctor comes in and reports his findings of what he has seen and believes need to be done next, so too in this Gospel from St. John, the apostles see and believe that the One who had been crucified has come back from the dead and begin to report their findings to others. This spiritual reality of the first Easter is certainly much more spectacular than any scientific or medical procedure as impressive as many have become in 2021.

It is all right to be impressed with science, so long as we know spiritually the source of all of science’s wisdom — namely the Savior and the spiritual life. Even the passing of the pandemic in the rearview mirror of our life is not so much the work of the scientists, but the work of the Savior who has given us the knowledge and ability to create a vaccine to end this worldwide problem that paralyzed our daily lives in such a profound way.

Yes, that medical procedure that I recently chose to undertake once again, was a perfect Lenten penance, as unpleasant as I find them to be every time. These procedures are a kind of Paschal Mystery — they are a movement from death to life, suffering to salvation, sleep, to an awakening of a new knowledge and hope in the life one is living on the earth. **May the dawn of that first Easter morning that brought hope and life to that small fledgling group of believers in Jesus of Nazareth, increase our faith in Him and His Holy Eucharist, not just on this Easter of 2021, but every Sunday when the sun comes up and every week when we come to Holy Communion and share in the Good News of the Eucharistic sacrament.** Happy Easter! Stay well!



With a total of 42% received, we are just 58% away from completing the cost of this major capital improvement project. As we go to press, we still have about 12 weeks remaining in our present Fiscal Year of 2020-2021. At this rate, if we could cover 4.8% each week, the financial end of this project would be completed by the end of June. This would be an incredible stewardship accomplishment and certainly a cause for even more Easter JOY! Please consider making a contribution in the weeks ahead if your heart will allow you to do so!
