

My Mother often wisely said, “People change!” And, while people can change for the better, they often change for the *not so better*, or dare I say, the worse. You see it in families. You see it in the family of faith. You see it among friends and folks that you work with in the business world.

But there are also people that I see and have known for many years, sometimes decades, that are as stable and certain as the sun shining every morning in the eastern skies. What changes people for the better? ***I would say that when we change and become better, it is through the grace of our Blessed Lord. But when we change for the worse, it is because we succumb to our own wants and wishes (dare I say sins), and we have taken over the steering wheel in our life rather than allowing the Savior to drive.*** When we start steering our own spiritual ship, our soul is at the mercy of whatever we might come across, any new philosophy we might find, any new trend we want to take up.

Show me someone that seems solid and immovable in his or her beliefs in the faith, and I will show you a person that is stable in their relationships with their Savior, their faith, their family, and their friends. These are the people that, in so many respects, seem unchanging through the passage of time. Show me someone who is non-practicing, careless or casual (at best) with the practice of their faith, and I will show you someone that has changed, and usually, if not always, not for the better.

I know I speak a fair amount about my own family, but it is what I know best. I think back to my parents, who in many respects were unchanging in their relationship with their children, with one another, and their Catholic faith. Yet, as I look upon my own immediate family, some have

changed radically while others are pretty much the same in personality and temperament and practice of the faith as they were 30 or more years ago. In the case of my own family, why did some members change and others seemed rather changeless in their relationships and how they viewed life and their life of faith? The answer is simple: RELIGION! From a non-scientific point of view, but a spiritual one, it seemed that those who went to Mass weekly and had a spiritual life; they seemed to be less troubled, more content, less upset, or irritated at others, less likely to hold grudges, and more settled than those in the family that were the “Occasional Catholics,” or as we say today, “Cultural Catholics.” It seems that many on the margins of faith (even if they go regularly to Mass) always seem to have a beef about someone else’s behavior, always thinking it is somebody else’s fault, but never seem to own any responsibility.

As I walk through the mall here in Mankato, or Wal-Mart, or even Target, I like to people watch. If I dress casually in just a pair of blue jeans and dress shirt, I feel I have over-dressed. People no longer seem to be dressing casually, but actually...well beyond casual. From exotic hair styles, to bodily piercings and tattoos, these radical changes in appearance are a cry for identity. ***These radical changes in appearance are a cry to change oneself into something or someone that is part of a group. So many in the western hemisphere have given up religious identity only to replace it with a new kind of secular religion that often involves a radical identity. The need to belong in the human condition is greater than ever, and today this basic human need to belong comes out in all sorts of unusual ways.***


In today’s readings, it is all about loyalty or, dare I say, conformity. I know, conformity is a bad word in this age of relativism, personal expression, and the 1960’s motto that is still popular today: “I GOTTA BE ME!” So, when the Lord introduces to them the Eucharistic theology of eating flesh and drinking blood, the crowd changes and turns on their tailcoats and walks away from the Lord. ***Why did the crowds walk away, but the apostles remained with Jesus? The answer is simple. The apostles had a deeper and more committed relationship with the Lord. Many in the crowds had a distant and more shallow relationship. The answer is really as simple as that. I have always been amazed at how people can so quickly walk away from their Catholic faith or for that matter their parish of origin. It has everything to do with a more distant relationship with the person of Christ and the community***

of faith.

Christ is unchanging! The Church is unchanging! The Creed is unchanging! So too, we must be unchanging in the ways of faith, so that we will not chase after every newest idea, fad, or false gospel that comes along. As my patron saint, Paul, writes to the Galatian community these words: **"...But even though we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to that which we have preached to you, let him be accursed. As we have said before, so I say again now, if any man is preaching to you a gospel contrary (or changed) to that which you have received, let him be accursed."** (Galatians 1: 8-9)

May we stay always unchanging in both our personality and practice of the faith with God and with others. May you remain steadfast and loyal to Christ and His Holy Church! See you at Mass!

Stewardship of Gratitude

Speaking of "gratitude," I am grateful that as we were above budget again this week, and as we come to the close of one-sixth of our new Fiscal Year of 2021-2022, we are down by just **\$2,381.55** in this strange present-post-pandemic time. Last year in 2020, at this very same time we had already contributed \$38,200.00 towards our Loyola Catholic School stewardship commitment, as we were noticeably above budget. We had also contributed to the Diocese a total of \$3,861.02. This year, we have not contributed anything at this point in either area. However, because the number of students from our parish attending Loyola has decreased slightly, our assessment numbers also slightly decreased this year from last year by \$9,106.78. (So, in some respects we have unconsciously moved forward in stewardship by almost \$10,000.) **The bottom line is that we are behind last year's giving by nearly \$37,000.** I also have had an additional unexpected kitchen repair at the cost of slightly more than \$2,500! Anything you can do in terms of stewardship would be greatly appreciated in these waning weeks of summer. As always, thank you for your gifts!!!

Parish Endowment Fund

The future of the parish is bright here at Holy Rosary as we are easily in the top ten parishes in size in the Diocese of New Ulm. In fact, I believe our parish population is around 5th or 6th largest. Until recently, we might have been the only parish that was seeing some growth. *(That seems to have been largely halted by the pandemic, but we are once again starting to gain new members.)* Again this week, we registered another household of 5 members.

It has been some time since I have reported on the status of our Endowment Fund that the Finance Council and I as pastor established shortly after my arrival. This money has been set aside in a special account and the principal can never be spent. The interest is permitted to be taken annually, however, to date, this has not been done. I believe it was 6 years ago that we began this account at \$00.00. As of this week, we have reached a grand total of \$351,649.61.

You are encouraged to contribute to this Endowment Fund at any time. Sometimes, families have chosen to contribute at the time of the passing of a loved one to insure that their stewardship will live on for many years to come. If you wish to make a contribution to the Endowment Fund, you are encouraged to make the check out to Holy Rosary Church and to write in the memo “Endowment Fund.”

As I have shared with the Finance and the Pastoral Councils, my hope is to reach the stewardship goal of one million dollars towards the end of my pastorate in another decade or so, if God is willing to give me that amount of time. May God bless all of you that have contributed to the parish through the general offerings each week as well as specifically for the Endowment Fund itself. May God bless you in your good stewardship and the sound future of Holy Rosary Church.
