Last weekend, if you were at Mass, you may have noticed [I hope that you noticed] I was away. The Diocese requires that a missionary is assigned to come and to speak to each parish throughout the Diocese annually. The Diocese and the Universal Church also requires that a

priest spend some time away for a retreat, either privately or directed, for prayer and reflection annually. Last week seemed as good as any time and since it was also the week that I added another year to the odometer of life, it is good to reflect on where I have been and where I am going in the next year. As my spiritual director candidly reminded me, "You now should consider yourself a "SENIOR" pastor!" Since there are only four pastors older than I am in the Diocese of new Ulm, I guess he is right. As Mark Twain so wisely reflected, that when we reach a certain age of maturity we are either the "Youth of Old Age" or the "Old Age of Youth". [I think I choose the later. It sounds a little bit better in my humble opinion!]

Today's readings remind us of something spiritual we as Roman Catholics fall short of through our teachings. One of the many things I pondered over these past days is God's power is so strong that He can not only create the world and the universe, but that He can also have a personal relationship with each one of us. How is that possible? The other Christian denominations that have grown out of the Catholic faith always seem to stress and to raise the question: "Do you have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ?" For me personally, it is a non-question, for as long as I can remember I have been in relationship with the Redeemer. However, I have come to discover this is not the case for many people and for that matter for many Roman Catholics.

In the First Reading from the Book of Wisdom, we are reminded both of God's infinite power as well as His personal relationship with each individual person, even the person who needs penance due to sin. For we read, "Before the Lord the whole Universe is as a grain from a balance or a drop of morning dew come down upon the earth. But you have mercy on all, because you can do all things; and you overlook people's sins that you may repent."

If the First Reading from the Book of Wisdom explains the theology of God's tremendous power to

create the earth as well as His personal relationship with each individual on this earth; today's Gospel from St. Luke then provides the practical reality by revealing the "personal relationship" that our Precious Lord, the Son of God, has with every person, even short, sinful, and slightly curious souls such as Zacchaeus, who was also a CHIEF tax collector!

For the God who created the trees, also cares for this tax collector. And not only does the Lord care about Zacchaeus, but He also wants to come to his house to share in a relationship that is really intimate as to take one's place together at a table through the sharing of a meal. It is one thing to talk on the street to someone, but it something much more intimate when one tells you to take a place at their table!

Next weekend is our annual parish festival, our eighth to be exact. There is no question that the reason we are doing this event is to raise needed monies for the parish as well as the various ministries we support from the Diocese of New Ulm to our area Catholic School commitment. Both of these areas run into hundreds of thousands of dollars each year.

Years ago, my old spiritual director reminded me that parish festivals and fundraisers are more than just about raising money, but they are also about raising relationships. For when the parish has a fundraiser, people work side-by-side with people, some whom they know and some that they do not know. New relationships are formed. Old relationships are renewed and strengthened. As this older priest shared with me in words similar to these: "Even if we held our annual festival and we did not make a cent, I would still have the festival each year. For while a fundraiser is about raising revenue physically, spiritually it is even more important to build and maintain our relationships with the Mystical Body of Christ!"

What is the "Church"? I hope that you are not going to say "A BUILDING!" No, the Church is the Mystical Body of Christ, made up of members that are in relationship with one another. The stronger those personal relationships are with one another, the stronger that local church becomes. It is really that simple. May we prioritize next Sunday above all else, not just for the stewardship, but even more so to strengthen our bonds with one another and ultimately with our Blessed Lord. See you next Sunday! Happy November Festival!!!





#### Class this Week – November 2nd!

This Wednesday as we come to class at 6:30 P.M., November 2nd's class coincides this year in 2022, with the Feast of All Soul's. The Catholic Church's two primary pillars of faith are the Holy Scriptures as well as tradition. One of our long-standing traditions that separates us from perhaps all other Christian denominations is our belief in purgatory, as well as the need to pray for our dearly departed. #### Office of the Bishop

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am writing to ask for your prayerful support for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS), as part of the Diocese of New Ulm's participation in the 2022 Triennial National Collection.

The AMS was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the Archdiocese is, "Serving Those Who Serve," providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academics, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veteran Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. This includes members of our own diocese.

While the salaries and retirement of military chaplains are paid for by the government, the AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of programs and services vital to the mission and ministry of its mission, including Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal and Veteran Affairs.

Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes or parish registries. The AMS has no weekly collections and relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its aforementioned programs and services.

Your support of the 2022 Triennial National Collection for the AMS will bring the Gospel, the sacraments and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our Country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from your own parish family.

Having served 21 years in the military as a chaplain and especially during three combat tours, I witnessed first-hand the critical support rendered to our men and women in uniform and their families.



# Did You Know?

- Without the AMS there would be no Catholic chaplains. The AMS is the only Catholic diocese in the United States responsible for endorsing priests to serve as military chaplains and for the Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers.
- AMS faithful are the men and women serving in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at a Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders - and their families.
- Programs and services readily available in other U.S. diocese, and vital to the men, women, and children served by this Archdiocese, include Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal, Vocations, and the pastoral care of Veterans.



- The AMS is the Archdiocese for the Military Services, not of the Military Services. This is an important distinction, as it receives no funding from the U.S. Government or U.S. Military and has no parishes from which to receive a weekly assessment. Instead, it must rely on the generosity of individuals, foundations, and organizations whose values and priorities align with its mission, programs and services.
- The AMS Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program is the only U.S. Vocations Program that provides priests to serve as military chaplains, and also to serve in parishes and dioceses across the country that struggle with their own critical shortage of ministers.
- In 2021, the number of sacraments celebrated for AMS faithful included 1,428 baptisms, 975 confirmations, 1,070 first Holy Communions, and 192 marriages.

# **AMS Coat of Arms**

The coat of arms of the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA is divided into three sections, one in red, one in silver or white, and one in blue — the traditional colors of the United States. In the uppermost portion, there is an American Bald Eagle holding in each claw the universal symbol of peace, a green olive branch. In the middle portion, there is a silver cross on the outline meridians of the earth.

In the lowest, the red portion of these arms, are the gold and silver crossed keys of Saint Peter. The composition of the arms conveys the message and mission of the Archdiocese for the Military Services

to be Americans bearing peace; to proclaim Christ
 all over the world; and to carry out the mission of the
 Church to offer healing through the forgiveness of sins.

Lori provided a history of how this organization evolved from the backpack food program at Franklin Elementary to an organization that now serves five school districts. It is possible to schedule group pack sessions, which typically are 45 minutes in length. Lori expressed appreciation for the donation we gave earlier in the year for \$500.00.

**Secretary's Report.** The minutes of the September 6th meeting were approved.

**Treasurer's Report.** Terri shared the treasurer's report, including the income from the Recycle Sale, which was \$3,354.63 and Bake Sale, which was \$478.00. Mary Zellmer moved we amend the budget to include a \$500.00 donation to Feeding Our Community Partners. Motion carried. Balances include: Checking \$24,387.08, Savings \$1,481.84, and Variable Rate CD \$6,289.40. Total cash on hand \$32,158.32. The treasurer's report will be filed for audit.

**Correspondence.** We received thank-you notes from the family of Daniel McGarry as well as a thank-you and \$2,500.00 donation from the Tom Kelly family in memory of Mary Kelly.

#### **Commission and Coordinator Reports.**

**Spirituality Commission.** Dolores Portz sent cards for Priesthood Sunday and has shared information via email regarding 40 Days for Life.

**Service Commission.** No report.

**Leadership Commission.** Arlyce Anderson attended the N.U.D C.C.W. Board Meeting in August. It is expected we will have no new priests ordained in our diocese in the next five years. There has been a decrease in the number of annulments in recent years and only 100 weddings in the entire diocese last year. The National Convention will be November 2nd-5th. Arlyce was the only Holy Rosary member who attended the Fall Gathering where Father Bruno Santiago spoke about the India Water Project.

**Reverence Life Coordinator.** Dolores shared a handout on behalf of Darlene Schorn with information about The Catholic Spirit: Pro-Life MOMS fight for abortion regulation and the Blue Earth County's MCCL Tour. We are sponsoring a table at the October 9th Options Gala.

**Legislation Coordinator.** Dolores shared a handout on behalf of Darlene Schorn with information about *Doe v. Minnesota*.

**Scholarship Coordinator.** Arlyce Anderson reported that scholarship donations are down within the New Ulm Diocese, although Holy Rosary is still current with our commitment.

**Communication Coordinator.** Mary Zellmer reported our roster has about 50 fewer names and the number of returned surveys is also down, 103 compared to 114 last year. Nine members have volunteered to call for bake sales.

**Funeral Committee.** Lynn Wilson is co-chairing the Funeral Committee with Maxine Davis. We have assisted with five funerals in the last month. Father Paul encouraged kitchen helpers to also attend the funeral Mass as this can be helpful when some attendees may not be familiar with the Mass responses. Max offered a suggestion regarding the serving of beverages.

**Sewing Group/Just Do It Crafters.** Some members have expressed interest in joining the sewing group.

**Recycle Sale.** Mary Grams thanked everyone who worked and donated to the Recycle Sale and Bake Sale, which profited \$3,054.63 and \$478.00 respectively. Arrangements have been made for remaining items to either be kept for the Country Market at November Fest or donated to area thrift shops. Max complimented everyone on how smoothly everything went.

**Kitchen Committee.** On September 19th recommendations were presented to Father Paul and the architect for the proposed church kitchen remodel. Father Paul has set a tentative completion goal of January 2024.

**Fall Luncheon.** There will be no C.C.W. Fall Luncheon this year due to the late date of the Recycle Sale and its proximity to November Fest.

**November Fest.** During the November Fest the C.C.W. will assist with the Country Market/Bake Sale/Sweet Shop November 4th, 5th and 6th. We anticipate selling plants and crafts at the country store.

**Family Fun Fest.** The proposed family fun fest is on hold for now; however, we do have volunteers for youth activities.

**Canning/Pie Making Party.** No apparent interest has been expressed in gathering as a group to make jelly and/or make pies.

**First Friday Mass and Adoration.** Lorraine Klaseus shared that this Friday there will be adoration following Mass, ending with benediction at 3:00 P.M. She distributed a sign-up sheet.
