I recall a member of my staff, two assignments ago, who belonged to a neighboring parish in our Diocese. I often asked how the Mass attendance was in their parish or what parish activity was taking place. One Monday morning I made a mighty big mistake and I asked this staff person what that pastor had preached on that previous weekend at Mass. The woman replied:

"LOVE! LOVE! LOVE! That is all we ever hear from that man Sunday after Sunday!" I smiled and replied, "There could be a lot worse topics than LOVE! He could talk every week about MONEY!" This staff person was not amused!

Maybe they will say of me [or are already saying] is that all he does is sing, and all too often he sings those darn songs from Denver! Well, last weekend, my voice gave out as I was a bit under the weather. I will give the guitar a little liturgical rest until the Holy Spirit inspires me once again. But that having been said, I don't think I have overexercised the topic of LOVE!?! Have I? But speaking of DENVER and LOVE, John Denver wrote a beautiful song of love that I sang recently at one of the weddings we had here at Holy Rosary. The song is entitled "Perhaps Love". Perhaps you are old enough to remember this song. Allow me to share a bit of the lyrics on John's definition of love with you.

Perhaps love is like a resting place, a shelter from the storm. It exists to give you comfort. It's there to keep you warm. And in those times of trouble, when you are most alone, the memory of love will bring you home. Perhaps love is like a window, perhaps an open door. It is there to give you comfort. It is there to keep you warm. And even if you lose yourself and don't know what to do, the memory of love will see you through...etc.

If I were to ask you what LOVE is, I suspect that the definitions you would give would be as wide and as varied as the number of people defining that word. Depending on what version of the Sacred Scriptures you read, the word LOVE is mentioned anywhere from 361 to 551 times in the Bible. Perhaps the shortest definition of LOVE is written in St. John's Gospel, as the evangelist defines LOVE in just a word. For St. John writes, "GOD IS LOVE"! Perhaps the longest definition of love is written by that long-winded apostle Paul, [kind of like a pastor named Paul] who defines love for the Corinthian community in some 67 words: For

St. Paul writes, if you recall: "...LOVE IS PATIENT, LOVE IS KIND. IT IS NOT JEALOUS. LOVE IS NOT POMPOUS. IT IS NOT INFLATED. IT IS NOT RUDE. IT DOES NOT SEEK ITS OWN INTEREST. IT IS NOT QUICK TEMPERED, AND IT DOES NOT BROOD OVER INJURY. IT DOES NOT REJOICE OVER WRONG DOING BUT REJOICES WITH THE TRUTH. IT BEARS ALL THING, HOPES ALL THINGS, AND ENDURES ALL THINGS. LOVE NEVER FAILS...".

So what can we conclude from the Christian and Catholic perspective as to what LOVE is from the longest definition of St. Paul to the shortest definition from St. John? Well, we first come to know the spiritual definition of LOVE is very different from society's definition of love. For far too often society will say that LOVE is about the SENSES and FEELINGS. But we, in the world of the SPIRITUAL, would say, that LOVE is less about the SENSES and much more about SACRIFICE, less about FEELINGS, and much more about FAITH!

On this Feast of Christ the King, we are not celebrating an earthly king or politician who will claim that they LOVE the LAND that they are LEADING, while enacting LAWS and LEGISLATION that are far from this thing called LOVE. Rather, what we celebrate religiously on this last and final feast of the liturgical year is that the Lord of Lords and King of Kings, Jesus Christ came to rule over our lives and our death in the most supreme form of love ever known on earth. And what is that SUPREME LOVE called. That supreme form of LOVE is simply called SACRIFICE.

In the First Reading this weekend from the Second Book of Samuel, the greatest politician that has ever walked the saintly soil of the Holy Land, namely King David, is anointed the King of Israel. How is it that David becomes the King after King Saul? Simple! Sacrifice! Recall the words of the first reading that is spoken by the tribes of Israel; "...it was you who led the Israelites out and brought them back". In other words, the Good News of the first reading is that "sacrifice begets sacrifice" "leadership begets or leadership".

Now, maybe after this explanation that I have just given you, today's Gospel account from St. Luke on the crucifixion of Christ on this great Feast of Christ the King won't seem so strange. For when Christ hung on the cross in SACRIFICIAL LOVE for sinners, Jesus revealed to the world that He was in fact that SUPREME SPIRITUAL RULER OF THE WORLD AND OF THE UNIVERSE.

May we aspire as spiritual followers of Christ the King, to follow Him in the ways of LOVE through a life of sacrifice and service so that one day we might share in His Eternal Kingdom in everlasting life! Happy Feast of Christ the King! See you next weekend at the start of the new liturgical year as well as the First Sunday of Advent! Peace!



[Although we still have monies coming in, and I am required to get this bulletin done early due to our publisher gearing down for the Thanksgiving holiday] at this point I can tell you that our overall numbers are UP!!! Last year, the gross income came to \$29,651.11. This year, we are still are receiving some additional monies but, we have already surpassed \$30,500.00!!! Yea! While we are still not even half-way into the new Fiscal Year of 2022-2023, we have the makings of a strong stewardship year, perhaps even stronger than last year. This will be wonderful as we will be able to set aside a good deal of money once again for the lower social hall, sacristy and restrooms.

Thanksgiving is only a week and a half away. I don't know if I will be eating turkey that day as I have no dinner plans at this point. But whatever I will do, I will have gratitude for the many material blessings God has bestowed on our parish of Holy Rosary these past 8 years. As always, thank you for your gifts!

Stewardship Corner

We are starting to make some preliminary preparations for the work that we plan to do in the lower social hall, the bathrooms, as well as the sacristy. I have been put on the list for a cabinet maker that will construct the new cabinetry for the sacristy, next year. The earliest that cabinets can be made will be the middle of 2023. [Of course, you may have read or seen that the sacristy received a new flat roof, which we believe was the first new roof in 70 years, after many patches and repairs.

Many months ago, we had put an order in for new front doors. During the Thanksgiving weekend, I will try and stop in at the local business to see what the status is on these doors, as they would be much more air-tight and will save money on the ever-rising fuel prices. I also will be visiting with this same company to get a bid on new windows for the lower social hall of church. From the outside it appears as if those lower windows were all new and replaced. However, only two of them are actually, new window units. This is an unforeseen cost. but the architect believes this is the primary reason that we are having moisture issues on those north and south walls. I suspect that we will need to order these windows this year, if we hope to have them installed by next summer. Someone once told me in Olivia when I was fixing up that parish plant, "Anyone can build a building but it takes someone special to maintain it". Thank you for your support of our ongoing repairs and restoration of our seven-decades old church.



Holy Rosary Worship Committee Holy Rosary Catholic Church November 3, 2022

The Holy Rosary Worship Committee met on Thursday, November 3rd at 6:30 P.M. The attendance of membership was very "light". It was decided to "lightly" go over the business that needed immediate attention and to hold the other business for the next meeting.

Pastor's Comments - Worship Committee

Father reported that is amazing that it has been eight months since our last Worship Committee meeting. Maybe the time since our last meeting seems so much shorter, because we have been doing so many things in liturgy and worship at the church. Of course, first and foremost, the parish moved from upstairs to downstairs, and back upstairs as well for worship. Thank you to those from the Worship Committee that assisted with the move downstairs. The church is still a work in progress but a good deal of the work was again completed this week as the two statues were installed as well as the Stations of the Cross were restored and were returned to their rightful places.

The next phase for the church is less about worship and more about hospitality. Some of the leadership of the Knights of Columbus and C.C.W. have met and have visited some social halls and parish kitchens in the areas. There was a recent meeting with the trustees, the parish administrator, the C.C.W. chair, and Father to meet with the architect from YHR, Margaret Fallingstad. The architect listened and reviewed the recommendations. She has returned to work on some preliminary sketches and ideas for the redesign of the church kitchen, social hall, bathrooms as well as the church sacristy. At this time we are waiting for these drawings to be submitted back to the parish office from the company. Father is anticipating that the church would be totally completed in the early months of 2025.

The liturgy and the preparations for the Fall Festival, November Festival is almost ready. The "Cedar Creek Gospel Band" is again performing and will be returning to Holy Rosary on November 6th, after a 2 year absence due to the pandemic. These older men do an amazingly professional job when it comes to performing the music that they have prepared.

We are only 21 days out until Thanksgiving, and we are only 52 days away from Christmas. Father is grateful to Brian Eggersdorfer, who decorated for the fall and for Thanksgiving. Father met with some of the ministers from North Mankato to prepare for the Thanksgiving Ecumenical Prayer Service on the Eve of Thanksgiving. Dates will need to be set tonight for setup and take down for Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Business: Fall Communal Anointing: The Fall Communal Anointing was a great success again with an amazing attendance of 90 individuals. 70 people attended the dinner after the anointing. Presently, there are 523 registered members of Holy Rosary that are over the age of 60. There are presently 46 members of the parish in health care facilities. 81 greeting cards have been sent out to parishioners that are homebound/infirm/etc. The next Communal Anointing Mass has been tentatively set for Monday, June 12th, 2023 *Memorial Mass of All Soul's*: This Mass has been set for Sunday, November 13th, 2022. All families who have lost a loved one in the past year will be contacted to attend this Mass through the membership of the Worship Committee. Dates for **Exposition/Benediction:** The dates for Exposition and Benediction were set through January of the New Year of 2023. Ministry Fair: The Ministry Fair that was held in Lent of 2022, was a great success with ministries from altar server to lector welcoming many new members as well as additional members on our various parish committees. Altar Server Party: The parish is returning to having an altar server party in appreciation to our altar servers that volunteer to assist at the altar on the weekends. The event will be held during the time of Faith Formation on the Wednesday after Thanksgiving at 6:30 P.M. in the lower social hall in church. Pizza and refreshments will be served as well a gift for those that have served. New servers are welcome. Last year's Confirmation class all served. Father is hoping that will again be the case this year with our present Confirmation class as it would fulfill the students 12-15 hours of community service if they serve through their senior year of high school. Decorating for take-down Advent and Christmas: The Thanksgiving, will occur on the Friday after Thanksgiving, in November beginning between 12:30 -1:00 P.M. The set-up for Christmas will take place on the 19th and 20 of December. *Organ Repaired:* The organ has been repaired, but Father recently learned from the organist the organ is experiencing new issues. The organ repair man will be contacted in the immediate future to further investigate the problem. **Ecumenical Prayer Service:** The Ecumenical Prayer Service for Thanksgiving will be held at the Methodist Church on Belgrade at 7:00 P.M. on the eve of Thanksgiving. Father will be leading the service.

Dear Parents of Faith Formation Students in Grades 5-12,

Your son/daughter has been instructed in Faith Formation recently in class and were told that if the majority of their class will attend the event on December 11th, there will be no class on that following Wednesday, December 14th, for them. The cost to attend is \$15.00 per student. If this amount is a hardship, the parish would cover the cost. We would leave from Holy Rosary Church at 2:30 P.M. from the south side of the main school doors of Holy Rosary and would return about 8:30 - 9:00 P.M. The parish would be chartering a bus, and the parish would assume the cost of the transportation.

It would be good to do something spiritual during the Advent season as we prepare for the great feast of Christmas and to deepen our young people's faith. 3.) 
