Models of Faith Formation Offered

- **Home Study** parents and children review material at home with resources and support from the parish
- **Family Program** (K-5) parents and children review material at home and attend 6 once-per-month intergenerational gatherings that reinforce what you are learning at home
- **Station Rotations** (grades 1-5) children attend two session per month that involve activities for various learning styles
- **EDGE** (grades 6-8) middle schoolers attend two sessions per month that involve large group activities and small group discussions

Adaptations to the Celebration of Sacraments

- **First Reconciliation** may be done privately on any Saturday afternoon or by appointment rather than with the larger group; special seating arrangements can be made
- **First Communion** may done privately during any weekend Mass or by appointment rather than with the larger group; special seating arrangements can be made
- **Confirmation** may be done privately in the Grotto Chapel or in the main church immediately before the large group celebration; special seating arrangements can be made
