
Principal's Perspective



From the School Counselor

Children can often get stuck in negative thought patterns, such as **catastrophizing** ("If I don't get a base hit I'll die of embarrassment"), **hyperfocusing on the negative** ("I can't believe I missed that goal," even if the team won), **perseverating on unfairness** ("The ball never gets passed to me"), and **feeling helpless** ("No matter how much I study for Math, I'm still going to fail my test").



According to psychologist, Dr. Mary Alvord, parents often try to squelch negative thoughts, but research suggests "thought stopping" can actually make the negative thoughts persist. Instead, help your child(ren) replace these thoughts with a more realistic and helpful perspective:

- "If I don't get a base hit, I'll be disappointed, but I can try again next time"
- "Even though I missed the goal, I'm happy my team won!"
- "The ball doesn't get passed to me as much as I'd like, but I support my team in other ways"
- "I work hard to prepare for Math. I know my hard work will pay off on my next
 test!")



More realistic and balanced thought patterns lead to positive actions, which lead to increased confidence, higher self-esteem, and greater happiness. Try this activity by Whole Hearted School Counseling to boost your child's self-talk.

HEALTH NOTES FROM NURSE ABBY

HAND-FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (HFMD)

WHAT IS HAND-FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE?

HFMD is most often a harmless rash of tiny red spots and water blisters on the hands and feet caused by the Coxsackie virus. The rash is typically seen on the palms, fingers, soles, and toes. It can also cause small mouth ulcers (sores). It typically affects infants and children under age 5, but older kids and adults can catch it as well.

HOW DO CHILDREN GET INFECTED?

- HFMD is a common, contagious illness that is easily spread to others.
- Most often it is mild and harmless.
- After contact with HFMD, children come down with symptoms in 3-6 days (incubation period).
- Children are able to return to school 24hrs after the fever is gone without any medication. Most often this takes 2-3 days.
- Children with widespread blisters may need to stay home until the blisters dry up. That can take about 7 days.
- Symptoms are the worst in the first few days but are usually completely gone within a week. Peeling of the fingers and toes after 1 to 2 weeks can happen, but it is harmless.

HOW TO TREAT HAND-FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE

- There isn't any medicine to treat or cure HFMD.
- Try to get your child to drink adequate fluids and stay well-hydrated.
- Mouth sores are painful. Blisters may also be painful, especially on the feet. To help with pain, you can give an acetaminophen or ibuprofen product.
- Blisters don't need any special treatment. You can wash them like normal skin.
- Blisters on the palms and soles do not open. Those on arms and elsewhere sometimes open. This fluid is contagious to other people. Open blisters do not need to be covered and they quickly dry over.
- If your child is diagnosed with HFMD, make sure to inform your child's school.




