This past Sunday began the season of Advent. Last Friday, Fr. Mark spoke to the students about preparing for Jesus, which requires some preparation. He talked about how preparing for a hurricane during hurricane season requires us to have certain items on hand. During Advent, our "Hurricane Jesus" preparedness kit is the Advent Wreath. Our students will notice these wreaths in their classrooms. Several students have asked me the meaning of the colors of the candles on the wreath, so I am sharing that with you:

- Advent week 1 Hope: Prophecy Candle (purple)
- Advent week 2 Peace: Bethlehem Candle (purple)
- Advent week 3 Joy: Shepherd's Candle (pink)
- Advent week 4 Love: Angel's Candle (purple)

Since Advent is the period of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas, HNJ students and faculty are also using the Hallow App to help us focus our prayers, music, and meditations. We have partnered with Hallow this year, and, therefore, have a free month for our families to use this resource. We choose Advent as the time to share this gift with you. All of the desires of my heart?


Do I dare to believe that God can make more time in a day-more joy in a day?



We are so proud of you, Gus! Keep working hard and doing great things!



The advances in technology mean today's parents are the first generation who have to figure out how to limit screen time for children. While digital devices can provide endless hours of entertainment and educational content, unlimited screen time can be harmful. Here



are some ways parents can help curb the negative effects of too much screen time:

- Educate yourself on electronics and the devices your child uses
- Model healthy electronic use
- Create "Technology-Free Zones" in your home (i.e. your dining room table, in the car, in bedrooms, during family fun nights)
- Set Aside Times to Unplug (i.e. an hour before bedtime)
- Schedule "Screen Free Night" for the whole family once a week or month
- Use Parental Controls
- Explain Why You're Limiting Screen Time
- Encourage Other Activities
- Make Screen Time a Privilege
