Dear Holy Name of Jesus Community,

The Gospel this weekend was the Widow's Mite. Fr. Mark presented a great and timely homily to our students on Friday. He spoke about how it was probably hard for the widow to give all that she has, but that it probably felt really good afterward. He then related that feeling to giving personal time when students decide to play with another student who is alone rather than the same group they are accustomed to playing with. The students were engaged in the homily and expressed that while it is hard to make that decision at first, it does feel very good afterward.

Then, Fr. Mark connected the sacrifices our parents made when giving to the capital campaign. He recognized how difficult it must have been for parents to make their meaningful gifts, but how great it will feel when they see the new building going up. When a community gives, great things happen. Our community is a testament to that.

With that thought, it is time to give an update on the new school building. Last month our architectural firm, Mathes Brierre, finished the drawings of our 3-story, 10-classroom building with a gym on the 2nd and 3rd floors. Posters of renderings of the building are in the basement outside the school office. We invite you to take a look the next time you stop by!

The drawings were sent out for bid to 6 general contractors. The bids are due on December 5, 2024. Once we have the bid tabulation, Fr. Mark and I will meet with the 3 boards at HNJ, the Finance Council, Advisory School Board, and Pastoral Council, to discuss financing to support the construction cash flow. Shortly after that, we will have our Groundbreaking Ceremony! Stay tuned!! Great things are happening at HNJ, and we thank you for your partnership.
