The Importance of Attendance

There is a clear connection between student attendance and student performance in school. Data shows that higher attendance equals higher achievement for all students. Talking to your child regarding the importance of attendance is crucial to his or her success. Chronic Absenteeism (missing more than 10% of days enrolled for any reason) is the single strongest predictor of academic and social decline in students. Children who miss school miss out on opportunities to learn, build lasting friendships, and develop the skills and attitudes needed to become good citizens and valued employees.

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD?

- Let your child know that you think school is important.
- Take an interest in your child's school work.
- · Limit and balance extracurricular activities.
- Provide a set time and a guiet, clean area for doing homework.
- Post the school calendar and notes on the refrigerator, or another prominent location.
- Set a regular bedtime schedule. Age should not be a factor.
- Provide your child with plenty of time to get ready for school.
- Don't expect your older children to stay home and act as babysitters for younger children.
- Set good examples and enforce rules.
- · Have regular communication with the school. If your child is ill, contact the school and explain the reason for the absence.
