

PRINCIPAL'S PERSPECTIVE

Dear Holy Name of Jesus Community,

As we enter this Lenten Season, I have been reflecting on the word Lent. In several languages, the word lent means slow, in slow time, or slowly. In music, lento means to be performed slowly. Slow is not a word that can be used to describe the beginning of this school year or even the past three years! I think that is why reflecting on this aspect of Lent captivates me at this time. I pray that we all have a chance to find moments when we discover ourselves living slowly. It is a pace that we are not accustomed to, particularly after the very fast Mardi Gras season we just experienced.

During a moment when you are able to slow down and be still, I invite you to listen to Father Mark's homily from Ash Wednesday. After he tells a really funny story, which you will have to listen to, he challenges us to view our daily penance during Lent as the door prize that leads to a greater grand prize, a transformation of our hearts. As we focus on prayer, fasting (daily penance), and almsgiving (sharing what you have with others), we have the opportunity to transform our love relationship with God, ourselves, and others:

- Prayer our love relationship with God (Finding God in All Things)
- Fasting our love relationship with ourselves (Striving for Personal Excellence)
- Almsgiving our love relationships with the people around us and humanity in general (Boys and Girls for Others)

What a great opportunity! And, we have the structure in place within our school community to help us reflect on and more fully develop these relationships by using the practice of Pray-dreaming as St. Ignatius did. Pause in a quiet place, ask the Holy Spirit to guide you, then daydream in prayer (pray-dream) about the following:

- 1. Imagine yourself as a really great lover of God.
- 2. Imagine yourself as a really great lover of yourself.
- 3. Imagine yourself as a really great lover of the people around you and humanity as a whole.

Play a movie in your head about the person you would be in each situation. After each pray-dreaming session, you will find natural results of the transformation. They will flow out of you naturally because of a transformation of your heart that comes directly from God, divine transformation. Naturally, you will become a better lover of God, a better lover of yourself, and a better lover of all the people around you.





CARPOOL SAFETY REMINDERS

Sidewalks and crosswalks should be used at all times.
Follow instructions of crossing guards.

Students should never walk through the car gates on LaSalle Place or Calhoun Street.

Parents may not exit their vehicles while parked on the blacktop. If you need assistance, drive around and go to the walker door.

Children should remain in seat belts or car seats until the car is stopped and they are exiting the car, and again as soon as they get back in the car.

Enter and exit the vehicle from the sidewalk side.

The HNJ carpool line is a cell phone-free zone. Please stay alert at all times to keep our students safe.

Once students exit the building for the day, they will not be allowed to re-enter the building for anything. If you need urgent assistance, drive around and go to the walker door.


