### Overcoming Test Anxiety

Test anxiety increases mistakes, reduces reasoning and working memory, creates confusion, and lowers test scores. More importantly, it's harmful to the well-being of our children. Fortunately, there are strategies you can use to help your child feel more relaxed and confident heading into the test.

- 1. Put Tests Into Perspective Encourage students to do their best, but remind children that test scores will not make or break their future. Tell them that they will always be loved and valued no matter what the test scores say. Explain that tests provide helpful information about what they're great at and what they still need to practice.
- 2. Help Them Practice If your child is nervous, start by asking why they feel nervous. Consider doing practice tests that you can discuss together. Don't push your child to study for standardized tests – these tests are meant to measure what your child already knows.
- 3. Provide Useful Test-Taking Tips Answer easiest questions first, and mark difficult questions that can be returned to later. Use the process of elimination by crossing off answers they know are incorrect. Read all answer choices carefully before selecting one. Answer all questions, even if you need to make an educated guess.
- 4. Teach Calming Strategies Practice grounding exercises like the 5-4-3-2-1 method prior to tests. Recite some testing affirmations the morning of a big test. Remind students that they won't know every single answer on the test, and that's okay!
- 5. Provide Encouragement Counter negative thoughts with a positive and encouraging statement: "You've practiced really hard and learned a lot this year. You might know a lot of the answers and get a higher score than you're expecting."

### 4th and 5th Girls Soccer

Congratulations to the 4/5 girls' soccer team for winning the New Orleans Athletic League 5th/6th South Championship with a score of 3-1 against Sacred Heart on Tuesday afternoon. Throughout the season, this talented group of young Gators faced mostly 6th-graders and utilized their aggressive style of play to relentlessly attack the goal. They achieved an impressive total of 23 shots on goal, compared to only 10 shots on goal by Sacred Heart.

Stella Miller opened the scoring by skillfully weaving through the defense to deliver a beautiful goal to the lower right side. Gigi Seerman also made a notable contribution with her goal, outrunning two Sacred Heart defenders to strike the upper left corner of the net. Vivianana de Candia capped off the championship scoring with a rebound goal after several attempts from her Gator teammates.

The Gator defense was strong throughout the game, keeping the Sacred Heart offense largely confined to their side of the field. Virginia Waldron and Olivia Hand performed excellently, conceding just one goal while achieving a total of 9 saves.

This victory marks the first time in seven years that an all-girls HNJ soccer team has won the championship. The Holy Name community is incredibly proud of your remarkable accomplishments.



#### **CARPOOL SAFETY REMINDERS**

Sidewalks and crosswalks should be used at all times.
Follow instructions of crossing guards.

Students should never walk through the car gates on LaSalle Place or Calhoun Street.

Parents may not exit their vehicles while parked on the blacktop. If you need assistance, drive around and go to the walker door.

Children should remain in seat belts or car seats until the car is stopped and they are exiting the car, and again as soon as they get back in the car.

Enter and exit the vehicle from the sidewalk side.

The HNJ carpool line is a cell phone-free zone. Please stay alert at all times to keep our students safe.

Once students exit the building for the day, they will not be allowed to re-enter the building for anything. If you need urgent assistance, drive around and go to the walker door.



# **Gator Spotlight**

This week's spotlight Gator is **Sanaa Bean**, who is a standout high school basketball player. Sanaa graduated from Holy Name of Jesus in 2020 and began her high school basketball career at Newman before transferring to Edna Karr in the hopes of winning a championship during her senior season.

Sanaa has earned numerous accolades throughout her high school basketball career. She was named to the All-District 1st Team three times, the All-Metro 1st Team two times, and was 1st Team All-State twice in her career. Sanaa also had an Honorable Mention to the All-State Team per LGR and was named Defensive Player of the Year in her sophomore season and Offensive Player of the Year in her junior season. Her stats include over 1,400 points scored, 800 rebounds, and 250 blocks. These accolades led Sanaa to become Louisiana's number four ranked player in the class of 2025 and the state's number one post player. Sanaa's incredible play on the court helped her team reach the semi-finals twice. Outside of her impressive play on the basketball court, Sanaa is excelling in the classroom with a GPA of 3.75

Once Sanaa graduates high school, she will be attending the University of Texas at San Antonio. Sanaa will play on the Roadrunner's basketball team and will be majoring in Kinesiology Pre-med. BRICK DETAILS: The bricks are 4" x 8" and are engraved using state-of-the-art laser technology. The price for a 4x8 brick is \$400.

PAVER DETAILS: The pavers are 8" x 8" and are engraved using state-of-the-art laser technology. The price for an 8x8 paver is \$800.

MINI REPLICAS: Mini Replicas are available for purchase for \$25. The 4x8 brick replica measures 1.5 x 3 inches (about the size of a business card), and the 8x8 paver replica measures 3x3 inches in size. Mini replicas will be shipped to the HNJ Parish Center. 


