


HNJ Night at the Pelicans game was a tremendous success. Thank you to the parents and HNJ coaches for creating this invaluable experience for our students.











Gator Spotlight

This week's spotlight is on **Sophia Freeze**, a standout cross country runner for the Loyola University WolfPack. Sophia graduated from Holy Name of Jesus in 2019 and went on to have a remarkable career at Ursuline Academy High School.

Throughout her time at Ursuline, Sophia demonstrated her talent as a runner, earning the MVP award for her team in both Cross Country and Track/Field for four consecutive years. Even more impressively, she placed in the top 25 at the State meets throughout her entire high school career. During her junior season, Sophia was crowned State champion in the 800-meter dash, setting a personal record of 2 minutes and 23 seconds during the race. In her junior year at Ursuline Academy, she remained undefeated in the 800-meter event, winning every race she entered that season. Sophia received all-District honors as a junior and was a member of the 4x200m and 4x400m all-District relay teams.

In addition to her achievements in athletics, Sophia excels academically, graduating with a 3.67 GPA from Ursuline, which earned her the LHSAA Scholar Athlete Award. Currently, as a freshman at Loyola University, she has a GPA of 3.21 while majoring in Biology with a Pre-Med focus.

When asked about her fondest memories at HNJ, Sophia shared, "What I miss most about HNJ is the sense of community I felt when I was there. Everybody knew each other, and because the campus was so small, my friends and I were very close."

Congratulations once again to Sophia on all her success, both on and off the course! The Holy Name community is incredibly proud of her accomplishments and the amazing person she has become!

Our new entry plaza at Holy Name of Jesus Church will feature an installation of commemorative bricks and pavers that can honor or memorialize loved ones in a special way. Engraved bricks and pavers are the perfect gift for weddings, anniversaries, graduations, or birthdays as well as a meaningful memorial for a loved one who has passed away.



We have two size options available: 4x8 and 8x8. You can choose from several options, including text only or text with a choice of several clip-art icons. Mini replicas are also available for purchase.

BRICK DETAILS: The bricks are 4" x 8"and are engraved using state-of-the-art laser technology. The price for a 4x8 brick is \$400.

PAVER DETAILS: The pavers are 8" x 8" and are engraved using state-of-the-art laser technology. The price for an 8x8 paver is \$800.

MINI REPLICAS: Mini Replicas are available for purchase for \$25. The 4x8 brick replica measures 1.5 x 3 inches (about the size of a business card), and the 8x8 paver replica measures 3x3 inches in size. Mini replicas will be shipped to the HNJ Parish Center. You will receive a call from us when they are available for pickup.


