Dear Holy Name of Jesus School Community,

As we step into this Lenten season, I've once again been reflecting on the word **Lent** and its connection to slowness. In several languages, *lent* means slow or in slow time. In music, *lento* is a directive to play at a slow tempo.

Slow. That's not a word I would use to describe this school year so far—or even the past few years! Life seems to move at a relentless pace, especially after the whirlwind of the Mardi Gras season. And yet, Lent invites us to do something countercultural: **to slow down.**

This sacred season calls us to deepen our connection with God, ourselves, and others through **prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.**

- Fasting Honoring our love relationship with ourselves (Striving for Personal Excellence)
- Almsgiving Deepening our love relationships with others (Being People for Others)

Lent is an opportunity for transformation, and within our school community, we will once again use a meaningful way to embrace it—through the Ignatian practice of **Pray-Dreaming**.

Here's how:

- 1. **Find a quiet space** and invite the Holy Spirit to guide you.
- 2. Daydream in prayer about these three things:
 - Imagine yourself as someone deeply in love with God.
 - o Imagine yourself as someone who truly loves and values yourself.
 - Imagine yourself as someone who loves and serves others wholeheartedly.
- Let the transformation unfold.

When we take time to pray-dream, we open ourselves to divine transformation—one that flows naturally from a heart touched by God's love. As Lent unfolds, may we all embrace this slow, intentional journey and discover the beauty in moving at God's pace.

LA GATOR PROGRAM FOR TUITION

The new LA Gator Program provides Educational Savings Accounts (ESA) to help families afford non-public school options.

Which HNJ Students Qualify for the 2025-2026 school year?

Students must reside in Louisiana and meet **ONE** of the following requirements:

- Entering kindergarten for 2025-2026 regardless of income, OR
- Enrolled in a public or charter school in 2024-2025, regardless of income, OR
- From a family earning ≤250% of federal poverty guidelines

FAQS

APPLICATION OPENS MARCH 1

What if I'm not sure that my student qualifies?

We need all eligible families to apply! Even if you're unsure about qualifying or participating, submitting an application is crucial. High participation demonstrates the strong demand for school choice, helping secure future funding and support for a broader range of families.

Is this the same as the voucher program?

No. LA Gator is a brand new state-funded program that offers Education Savings Accounts for families. It is not a voucher program.

How does this fit into the HNJ Admissions process?

All students must apply, be accepted, and enroll in Holy Name of Jesus School before LA Gator funds can be used at HNJ.

What if my student already receives HNJ financial assistance?

If your student currently receives financial assistance directly from Holy Name of Jesus School, you must apply for the LA Gator program in order to continue qualifying for HNJ assistance in future years.

How much will I receive?

The LA Gator program provides between \$5,243 and \$15,253 to each qualifying student to apply toward tuition.

How soon do I need to apply?

The application portal opens on **Saturday, March 1 at 9 a.m.** Applications are first-come, first-served, so don't wait! There is limited funding available for the upcoming academic year.

When will I be notified if my student will receive funds?

Families will be notified in the summer if their student's LA Gator application was approved.



EMPOWERING CHILDREN WITH ANXIETY

When we allow children to struggle or to face anxious situations, we allow them the opportunity to to overcome those challenges and come out feeling victorious!

Here's how parents can help:

- Offer opportunities for gradual exposure to situations that may lead to anxiety
- Work together with your child to complete a difficult task
- Create small-risk experiences
- Stand firm when your child complains or demands
- Compromise when a child may be uncomfortable
- Help your child work through and accept their errors
- Allow your child to experience natural consequences

HNIMUSIC

Every day, music educators across the United States are shaping lives by guiding students through a transformative journey of exploration, practice, and growth. While parents and the wider community get to witness the magic of performances, they often miss the powerful day-to-day moments of music education, connection, and discovery that truly make the process special.







What music is happening at HNJ School?

- ~Weekly interactive music classes offered to EVERY HNJ student grades Pre-K1 through 7th grade.
- ~Every day during assembly Ms. Williams works with all students grades 1-7 on singing and signing (ASL sign language) our liturgical songs.
- ~Third grade students learn how to play recorder. Some have earned "black belts" in our Recorder Karate curriculum.
 - ~Interactive LPO music field trip for grades 2, 3, 4, and 5
- ~HNJ Choir sings weekly for Mass. ~Through the Jazz and Heritage Partnership Grant, HNJ will purchase a brand new set of tone chimes for our music classes and for student performances at the church.
 - ~HNJ Choir attended a vocal workshop with VOCES8, a Grammy-nominated British vocal ensemble and is now preparing to compete in the Large Ensemble Festival Competition in April @ UNO.
- ~HNJ currently has over 60 students taking private piano, quitar, and voice lessons in our after school music program.
- ~Through the Jazz and Heritage Partnership Grant, HNJ will host guest artist, Joel Dyson, as she provides a music series open to grades 4-7.
- ~All 4th graders are learning how to play the ukulele and compose their own songs.

ARETESCHOLARSprovides private K-12 scholarships exclusively to qualifying low-to-moderate-income students. The scholarships empower parents who otherwise have limited options to select a school that best meets their child's unique gifts, talents, and learning needs.

Maximum scholarship amounts: \$4,400 for grades K-8; or \$4,950 for grades 9-12.

Application period: February 25, 2025–May 31, 2025 (or until we receive 4,000 applications, whichever comes first)

Note: Applications are first-come, first-served, with priority given to returning students, and students using the Louisiana Scholarship Program Scholarship. An application does not guarantee a scholarship.

To be eligible for a scholarship in Louisiana, a student must meet the following income, residency, and prior school year requirements

- 1. Louisiana resident, AND
- 2 Enrolled in Louisiana public school for 2024-25, OR
- . Entering kindergarten in 2025-26, OR
- 3 Received a TDC or Louisiana Scholarship Program award in 2024-25, AND
- . Family income less than the following maximum amounts:

Our new entry plaza at Holy Name of Jesus Church will feature an installation of commemorative bricks and pavers that can honor or memorialize loved ones in a special way. Engraved bricks and pavers are the perfect gift for weddings, anniversaries, graduations, or birthdays as well as a meaningful memorial for a loved one who has passed away.



We have two size options available: 4x8 and 8x8. You can choose from several options, including text only or text with a choice of several clip-art icons. Mini replicas are also available for purchase.

BRICK DETAILS: The bricks are 4" x 8" and are engraved using state-of-the-art laser technology. The price for a 4x8 brick is \$400.

PAVER DETAILS: The pavers are 8" x 8" and are engraved using state-of-the-art laser technology. The price for an 8x8 paver is \$800.

MINI REPLICAS: Mini Replicas are available for purchase for \$25. The 4x8 brick replica measures 1.5 x 3 inches (about the size of a business card), and the 8x8 paver replica measures 3x3 inches in size. Mini replicas will be shipped to the HNJ Parish Center. You will receive a call from us when they are available for pickup.


