Additionally, Dominic Rizzo became the first PreKindergarten 4 student to finish in the top three. The Counseling Department at HNJ had a fantastic year! Within our comprehensive school counseling program, we develop strategies to work with students both in groups and individually. Together, Ms. Morgan and Ms. Angelle, our Social Emotional Learning Teacher provided over 658 student services this year! Students were referred to the counseling department by teachers/faculty, parents, and themself. The top reasons students were referred to the counselor this year include: coping skills/emotional regulation, impulsivity, feelings/mood/affect, peer relations, and friendship skills.






Gator Spotlight

Inhale, Exhale...Shoot! follows Kunall the Pelican, a talented young basketball player who loves the game—but when it's time to take the big shot, anxiety creeps in. His wings tremble, his belly tightens, and his mind fills with doubt. What if he misses? What if everyone is watching? Set in the colorful heart of New Orleans, this beautifully illustrated picture book offers more than just a story about sports. It gently introduces children to mindfulness and breathwork as tools for managing stress, self-doubt, and performance anxiety—on the court and in everyday life. With encouragement from his coach and support from his teammates, Kunall learns to center himself, take a deep breath, and trust in his abilities.


